School Uniform Requirements: As per school policy and procedures, students are required to wear a school uniform that meets the schools' uniform requirements. Students are also expected to be in uniform for school photo day and when other photos are taken, and when taking part in representative events and off-site activities.

It has come to our attention recently, that some students are regularly not wearing uniforms. Some students are also wearing tights that are extremely short and not in align with sun safety expectations, as they are not being worn under shorts or skorts.

Please be reminded of the following school uniform expectations:

<u>Daily Uniform Requirements/Options</u> (from Uniform Shop):

- Sports trousers;
- Sports shorts;
- Drill/cargo material pants;
- Fleecy jacket;
- Microfibre jacket;
- Polo shirt;
- Long sleeve polo shirt;
- Skort;
- School bucket hat (all year round during break times and sport/physical education sessions & carnivals):
- School beanie (optional Term 2/3 before school and when permitted during class times).

<u>Daily Uniform Requirements (from elsewhere):</u>

- 150th MPS Birthday hoodie;
- Blue tights/stockings (under MPS shorts/skorts);
- Blue or black socks (white if unavailable);
- Raincoats/other coloured hats on route to/from school;
- Year 6 Shirts/Hoodies (Year 6 students only);

- School Hoodies (all students). Sports Day Uniform Requirements (Uniform Shop):
- House coloured shirt on sports and carnival days (Pelicans: Blue, Kookaburras: Green; Bellbirds: Red, Swans: Yellow);
- Team uniforms (provided for competition days).

Mufti Day Expectations and Requirements (other):

- Safe enclosed/sport friendly shoes are required;
- No singlet tops or midriff/crop shirts permitted on mufti days.

Requirements – Other Apparel:

- No variations to the school beanie, hat or other items should be worn at school (an explanatory note from a parent/caregiver could outline the use of an alternate 'like item' should other items not be in stock/available);
- Socks are to cover the ankle and not have logos;
- Primary School Sports Association (PSSA) hoodies (obtained when representing the District Team at Zone Sport) may be worn at school to recognise student achievement, for one week after the jumper was received/worn at a representative level and on full carnival days/at sports assemblies and other events representing the District at Regional Level;
- School bags and library bags are available but not compulsory;
- Students must not wear makeup, unless approval is given by the Principal (ie: school performances, medical/wellbeing reasons);
- No earrings/jewellery is to be worn for sport/representative sport as per PSSA Sport Guidelines;
- Studs and small earrings should be worn for safety reasons, should a student wear earrings;

- For safety, it is recommended that necklaces, chains, wrist bands and bangles are not worn by students. If students wear them they may be required to remove them during some activities. Watches acceptable, but again may need to be removed during certain activities for safety (ie: due to PSSA Sport policy) or during assessment activities (ie: smart watches);
- Smart watches must be in airplane mode when on school grounds.

OUTCOMES:

- Students not wearing uniform are not published on social media/media, except in the event of a mufti day/camp where approved by the Principal;
- Students may lose their SRC/representative privileges if they do not wear uniform;
- Students must wear uniforms for photo days. With minor differences, may take part in back rows (or have clothing pool items provided);
- Uniform non-compliance may be recorded as a minor inappropriate behaviour on school recording systems;
- Non-compliance may result in a 'minor' inappropriate behaviour record but will not result in students attending the Reflection Room.

Camp Reminders: Year 5 and 6 students all have camps coming up in the next two weeks. Please remember to get your child to school on time, so that they do not miss the bus! Pack lists and itinerary information will be sent home shortly.

Arrival times back to school are estimated and will be confirmed/updated as required via the school Facebook page. Keep up to date with what is happening at camp, by checking out the photos on Facebook in the coming weeks.

Year 6 2026: The Class of 2026 have selected their Polo/Hoodie design for next year. The polo shirts will be teal with white printing while the hoodies, will be navy blue with teal writing.

The cost for each polo shirt is \$40.00 and the hoodie is \$57.00. Orders to be complete before the 18th November. No extension to the ordering timeline will be possible.

*The Year 6 polos and hoodies are purchased from a different supplier than the regular Merimbula PS school uniform, so if in doubt order the bigger size. We have some samples in the administration office, for students to look at for sizing if required.

Mobile Phone Ban Policy Reminder:

Students in public primary schools and high schools across NSW have had to follow a phone/smart device ban since Day 1 of Term 4, 2023, as the NSW Government delivered its commitment to ban students' use of phones at school. The ban came into force after consultation with teachers, students and parents; and applies during class, recess and at lunch and when on school sites/excursions. Students are still permitted to carry a phone while travelling to and from school. The ban on use of phones in public schools fulfills a key election promise. Students at Merimbula Public School were reminded again in Term 3 and this week of the ban.

Students who need to carry phones on route to and from school must hand their phones into the front office each day. They must be turned off or put on silent. Once phones are collected at the front office, they are immediately placed in a locker. Students deposit their phone at the school's front office at the start of the school day and collect it at the day's end (or when leaving the school premises).

Phones are to be turned off before entering the school premises, and should not be turned on until after students have left school grounds. This is the same for smart devices such as tablets. Smart watches must be in airplane mode when on school grounds. Should a student be seen using a smart watch for reasons other than checking the time, they will need to hand it in to the office in future, and will receive a caution. These expectations are also in place at off-site activities, after hours school activities and on excursions.

Schools have been given the authority to determine how they enforce the ban and respond to any breaches. At Merimbula Public School, students who do not hand their phone/device into the front office, and have it with them on site, will be recorded as having breached the Department Ban and school Behaviour Code/Procedures. Students will receive a Major Notification recording and will have one break session in the Time Out Room to discuss their breach. Students who use their mobile phone during school hours will receive a Formal Caution to Suspend, in addition to support in the Time Out Room. Should students use a mobile phone on site a second time, they may be suspended. Students who repeatedly fail to hand in their mobile phone will receive a Formal Caution for continued disobedience, in line with the school's Discipline Policy. Students who are deemed responsible enough to have a mobile phone need to demonstrate that responsibility by adhering to Department of Education Policy and School Discipline Procedures.

Principals and teachers can authorise the use of mobile phones for educational purposes, or as part of a reasonable adjustment for student learning and wellbeing — such as monitoring blood sugar levels for

students with diabetes. If students require the use of personal mobile devices, they will be provided with a Mobile Device Agreement to sign with their parents. At this time all devices used by students at school are provided by the school. Student devices are not required during school hours.

Parent and Carer Support Hub and Resources for Families - Supporting Children with Disability: A new online hub was launched for parents and carers, in 2021, featuring information about the supports available for students with additional learning and support needs or disability. If you have not yet checked it out, it is worth a look. The one-stop online resource will ensure parents and carers are able to easily find up-to-date information about how to access support. Parents can also use the hub digitally or access printable sheets on key topics related to their child's education.

The hub has a tool to help parents and carers know when their child can start school and it can help with enrolment information. Parents and carers will get a personalised timeline when they enter their child's date of birth. The timeline

Stopping The Spread of Childhood Infections: Infections are common in children and often lead to illness. If your child has symptoms of an infection, they should visit their doctor to rule out an infection before returning to school. Students with the following infections are required to stay at home: Chickenpox (Varicella); Conjunctivitis; Gastroenteritis; Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease; Hepatitis A; Impetigo (School Sores); Influenza, Measles; Mumps; Ringworm; Rubella (German Measles); Scabies; Scarlet Fever; and Whooping Cough. If a child has Glandular Fever, they do not need to be excluded from school unless they are sick at the time

If they are showing flu-like/COVID-19 symptoms, a letter from their doctor sharing it is fine for them to be at school would allow them to attend. Students with head lice do not have to miss school if they have commenced effective treatment.
