High School Transition

It will be very exciting on 2 December when all Year 6 students going to government (public) high schools have their High School Orientation Days. This may also be a time when many families have questions about what they need to buy for their child to be prepared for high school. The Department of Education has set out some very clear information about what families can expect. At Merrylands PS, we apply school funding subsidies to all excursions to assist families and also provide subsidies or payment plans for uniforms. We do not ask for financial contributions. Instead we appreciate when families support school P & C or SRC fundraising events across the school that provide funds for school projects or charities.

Office News

Early Leave for appointments

Families are strongly encouraged to arrange appointments outside of your child's learning time. Their learning time at school is our no.1 priority! We understand the challenges that families may face with specialist appointments or emergency situations. As all absence is visible and checked by the Department of Education, please ensure you provide documentation of appointments. This can be by screenshots of appointment texts or medical certificates/reports verifying where your child was when not at school. It is not always easy to locate children during break times when there are 625 students playing, so contacting the school in the morning is advisable. It can also be disruptive to the class learning to interrupt the teacher in the afternoon learning session so that a child can pack up and leave. If your child is accessing therapy sessions that overlap with school hours and you haven't had a conversation with the school, please contact the office so we can support this in the best way possible.

Not Returning

If you are not returning to school next year please contact the office by phone or by email.

Leave

If you are going on leave and not returning until after the Term 1 Monday 2 February 2026 start date please ensure that you have completed an extended leave form and also advise by letter that they will be returning to school for your child's enrolment place to be held at Merrylands Public School. This is a Dep.of Education requirement that is linked to our teacher allocation so it is important!

Kindergarten

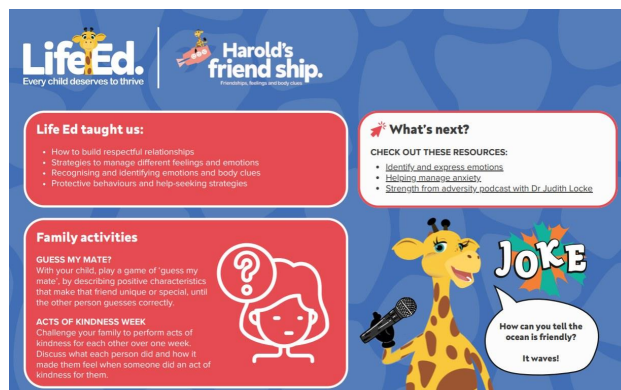

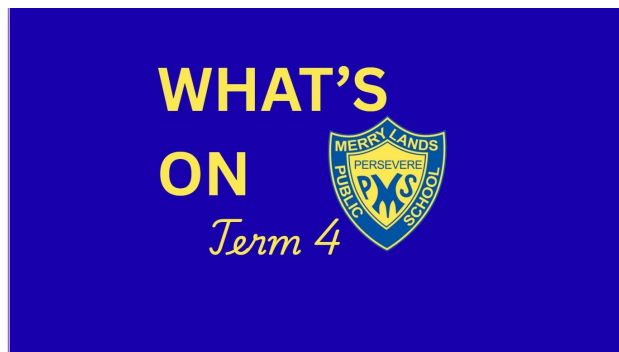

Tuning In To Kids is a six-session parenting program for parents of children aged 5-12 who would like to learn how to:-

- Be better at talking with your child?
- Be better at understanding your child?
- Help your child learn to manage their emotions?
- Help to prevent behaviour problems in your child?
- Teach your child to deal with conflict?

Tuning in to Kids shows you how to help your child develop emotional intelligence. Children with higher emotional intelligence:-

- Have greater success with making and keeping friends
- Have better concentration at school
- Are more able to calm down when upset or angry
- Tend to have fewer childhood illnesses

Emotional intelligence may be a better predictor of academic and career success than IQ!
