What's happening in our Classes - Weeks 7 and 8

Year 3-6 class will be studying:-

Maths: Students will learn to tell time using both analog and digital clocks. They will explore the duration of events and practice calculating elapsed time. These skills will help them understand and manage time effectively in their daily lives.

Novel Study: We will continue to read "The Silver Donkey", which the students are enjoying to read. We will use this text to also focus on enhancing their writing. They will learn to use various literary tools, including personification, to add depth and creativity to their sentences.

Reading: In our reading sessions, we will be using the Cars and Stars program to help students recognise cause and effect relationships. This will improve their comprehension skills and encourage critical thinking as they connect events and ideas within the stories.

History: In our history unit we will learn about The Australian Colonies. Students will explore the foundations of our nation, learning about key events, figures, and the daily lives of people during that period. This will foster an appreciation for our history and heritage.

Science: In Science, we will delve into The Material World. Students will investigate various materials, their properties, and how they are used in everyday life.











What's happening in our Classes - Weeks 7 and 8

K-2 Class

Literacy:

- Continue exploring the book Spoon, focusing on rhyme and the author's use of language to describe characters. Encourage students to identify examples of descriptive language and discuss how it enhances their understanding of the characters.
- Reinforce explicit phonics teaching through engaging activities that promote reading fluency and comprehension.

Maths:

- Dive into the world of shapes by exploring both 2D and 3D forms. Students will identify, create, and draw various shapes.
- Engage them in activities that involve finding smaller shapes within larger ones, fostering spatial awareness and shape recognition.

Dance:

• Dedicate time to learning and perfecting the dance routine for the upcoming performance. Focus on teamwork, rhythm, and expression as students practice their choreography.

Science:

• Investigate the use of different materials in creating various products. Students will design their own products, considering the properties of materials and their suitability for specific purposes.

History:

- Utilise artefacts to help students understand historical events and contexts. Discuss how these items provide insight into past lives and cultures.
- Begin exploring the evolution of technology over time, examining how advancements have changed the way we live and work.

Year 3 - 6 Class War Memorial Excursion

Our Visit to the War Memorial by Jessie

First we had to lay a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Ash and Charlotte laid the wreath, Olivia said the Ode and Brax thanked Andy for coming to talk to us.

After that we went to find the names of some people who used to come to Michelago Public School on the wall. We found John Ryan and put a poppy next to his name.

Then we split into two groups. My group went inside and we talked about an Aboriginal man who went to World War I and captured 14 enemy soldiers by himself.

We saw the painting called 'The Ghosts of the Menin Gate" and then we went into the World War II area. We learned about a hospital ship that was torpedoed by the Japanese. Only 64 people survived including one nurse.

After that we did a scavenger hunt outside the War Memorial, then walked down Anzac Parade to see the memorials.

After lunch we got back on the bus and came back to school.





K-2 Class National Botanical Gardens

On Tuesday the K-2 class went to the Australian National Botanical Gardens for their materials science unit.

We met a guide who showed us different plants that are used by some Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people for food and utensils. We crushed wattle seed for flour, and lemon myrtle for its smell and collected Bunya Pine seeds. After the tour we went to the Inland Australia section to see the red sand and desert landscape and then to the rainforest.

On reflection the students commented on what they liked -

Abby - The rainforest was really green and pretty

Kayden – the rainforest was full of mist and we drew a picture

Nikoda - The lookout at the desert was really pretty

Mabel – There was a bee hotel, like ours but heaps bigger
