We have continued to see significant growth in spelling results across K to 6 through our whole school implementation of Spelling Mastery.


This program provides explicit and systematic instruction with daily practice and the data clearly reflects its impact.

We are incredibly proud of our students for the effort they put in each day and deeply appreciative of our staff who deliver this program consistently and with energy.

Results from recent water testing

Michelago Public School Works notification | 12 November 2025

Dear staff, parents, and carers,

Drinking water quality testing was recently conducted at Michelago Public School as part of our routine water testing program.

This biannual routine testing was carried out on Thursday 30 October 2025. The results, received on Monday 10 November 2025, identified contamination in the tank water supply used at the school.

Testing confirmed the presence of lead in the following locations:

- kitchen sink in admin building A
- bee room sink in building G.

As a precautionary safety measure, access to the affected sink outlets have been restricted. Signage is in place to remind students and staff not to use the sinks. Bottled water and hand sanitiser is being supplied to staff and students as needed.

We are working with an independent hygienist to undertake any necessary remediation work. All remediation works will be carried out by qualified contractors, and additional testing will be conducted following this work to ensure the water is safe for use.

The health, safety, and wellbeing of our school community remain our highest priority.

2025 School Swimming Program

On **Thursday November 27 and Friday November 28** our students will be participating in our school swimming program at Lakeside Leisure Centre in Tuggeranong.

This year our program will run for two full days of swimming instruction. The first day will focus on explicit teaching of water safety and survival techniques and the second day will focus on stroke development.

When the permission note is sent home we ask that you please indicate your child's swimming ability as accurately as possible. It is always better to underestimate ability rather than over estimate.

The first session on day one will be an assessment of student swimming skills so that we can group students appropriately and ensure instruction is delivered at each student's point of need.
