Their work often happens quietly, but its impact is far-reaching. Miro, thank you for the expertise, care, and collaboration you bring every day.







Jesus commissioned his disciples to preach the gospel. Our mission, as Scripture Teachers in the Public Schools, is a continuation of that commissioning. It becomes one of the ways in which our Parish of St Benedict's reaches out in prac:cal love to our young people and their families. What do we do in Scripture Class?

We aim to provide the children attending Catholic Scripture with a solid understanding of the Catholic faith, based on Scripture and Tradition.
