#### Class Formation for 2026



It is hard to believe that we will shortly commence the process of forming classes for 2026! To assist in this process, please advise the office as soon as possible if you will no longer be attending Mimosa next year.

Our class formation processes have been sent out this week. Parents will have the opportunity to submit any significant or updated information by no later than Friday Week 6 (21st November). As stated clearly in the information distributed, great care is taken when forming classes each year to ensure the best possible outcomes for every student.

#### **Student Allocation Process:**

The allocation of individual students to particular classes will be based upon the individual needs of students which may be social, intellectual, emotional or physical. The identification of these needs will be achieved through:

- Professional deliberations of staff who are familiar with each student.
- Consideration of academic and wellbeing data.
- Student's educational history (previous classes, special circumstances etc).
- Student's nomination of positive peer relationships (5 students nominated per student allowing each student to be allocated to a new class with at least one of their nominated peers).
- Parent presentation of significant information about their child (health, history, social or emotional factors).

#### **Composite Classes**

We often receive questions from parents regarding **composite classes**. In reality, every class is actually a composite class when you consider that there may be up to an 18 month age gap between students in a class, and a range of up to 4 grades in achievement levels between students within any given class.

Great care is taken by our teaching team to determine the most suitable students for a composite class to ensure a positive experience, both socially and academically, for our students. If a composite class is formed for 2026 and your child is selected for it, you will be notified before the end of the year.

#### **Band Tour**

Congratulations to our students who attended the 3 day band tour at the end of last term. We have received outstanding feedback from the schools they performed at regarding not only their incredible performances, but also their respectful behaviour, friendliness and cooperative spirit. What lovely feedback to recieve!

#### Recylcing



Well done Mimosa, for all your recycling efforts in Terms 2 and 3!

I have dropped off two more bags of whiteboard markers and textas to officeworks, where they will be repurposed into new stationery items.

I also put a multitude of batteries into the Woolworths Glenrose battery recycling box, where they will separate the components for use in other products. Did you know that 95% of the components of a battery can be recycled?

FYI, in case you hadn't noticed, Woolworths has reinstated their soft plastic recycling, so families can recycle their own soft plastic at Glenrose. Don't forget to snip off any paper stickers, such as delivery labels or use-by-date stickers, so it doesn't contaminate the waste stream. Be the change you want to see in the world. These bags are recycled and made into many different practical products, such as garden beds, bollards and seating.

Our Garden Club has also boosted their \$ total, via the in-school return and earn scheme and we are ready to buy seedlings for the next growing season!

The most exciting news of all though is that, thanks to our community, we have collected enough clean old socks to provide most classrooms with 'sock dusters' for 2026, which will eliminate the need for plastic-backed whiteboard dusters, including our itsy-bitsy teenyweeny impact on the manufacturing, packaging and transport of these products. A huge thank you to all who have contributed their clean old socks. We will still collect clean used socks to further boost our supplies, as currently it is on a 1 sock-ish between 2 students basis throughout K-6.

We will also continue to recycle prescription glasses through the initiative at Forestway OPSM, where prescription glasses will go to remote communities (no sunglasses, nor glasses cases sorry) and I will recycle any batteries and oral care items, as well as the whiteboard markers, textas and highlighters that we use at Mimosa.

#### **Bush Regeneration**

Last term in weeks 9 and 10, 4O and KG planted some native tubestock around the front entrance of our school and in the garden around the KG classroom. These native plantings will add to Mimosa's diversity of plants and when grown some more, will encourage a wide range of animal species to inhabit the area as well. Students planted species such as Dianella, Acacia, Bottlebrush and lovely scented Native Mint.

In addition to this beautification, KG has made some gorgeous labels for our new native flora using Artline pens and watercolours. Our community will be able to easily identify each species of plant as they grow. Look at some of their stunning Acacia, Callistemon and Banksia labels in the following pages.

Mimosa Public School contains one of the last fragments of critically endangered "Duffy's Forest" bushland in Northern Sydney, and we think it's worth protecting for our kids, the school, and the wider community.

There are 100 year old trees in the school with galah and cockatoo families living in their hollows, and there's even a resident echidna!

Multiple generations of Mimosa parents have taken time out of their busy lives to care for this bushland, and we want to continue this tradition.

#### What is bushcare?

Bush care is the practice of restoring degraded bushland areas into healthy natural ecosystems. We will be controlling weeds, improving wildlife habitat and planting local native species.

#### Our aims:

- A monthly bushcare meetup with planting, weeding and caring for the bush on the school grounds.
- A quarterly working bee for the wider school community with food, educational workshops, planting and improving the school grounds.
