Pick-Up & Drop-Off

Just a friendly reminder to be safe and follow the road and parking signs during drop-off and pick-up times. This is so important for student safety and we ask for your support in being positive role models for our students. Schools are always incredibly busy places during drop-off and pick-up times and safety is always a big priority, especially during those times.

Please ensure that you and your children use the pedestrian crossing if crossing the road at Ashburton Drive or Terry St. Also please be mindful that parking officers and police regularly patrol the streets around our school and issue fines where people are doing the wrong thing in relation to parking and driving offences.

Riding Bikes and Scooters to School

We love to see students riding bikes and scooters and encourage this as a healthy way to go to and from school. Each year we remind students about the importance of safety when riding bikes and scooters. This includes riding carefully on the correct side of the road or pathway and always wearing a helmet. All students who wish to ride a bike to school must complete a bike note and have it signed by parents and myself following a bike inspection to ensure safety compliance. All bike notes must be returned to school by the end of Wk 4. Students will not be permitted to continue riding their bike to or from school if they have not returned their note by then. Students will receive one warning for incorrect or unsafe riding behaviour. The second instance will result in a 4-week ban. A third instance will result in a ban for the remainder of the year. Warnings and bans will be communicated with parents via School Bytes. Bike notes will be available from the office throughout the year.

P&C Meeting

The first P&C Meeting for the year will be held on Monday 17 February at 6:30pm in the staffroom in the main admin building. We would love to see some new faces at this meeting so please consider coming along. P&C Meetings are a great opportunity for parents to find out about what's happening at our school and contribute to our future directions and fundraising efforts.

IMPORTANT SIGNS AROUND SCHOOLS



NO PARKING

You can stop in a No Parking zone for a maximum of 2 minutes to drop-off or pick-up passengers. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times.





NO STOPPING

Don't stop on length of road where there is a No Stopping sign. (Exemptions for medical emergencies, vehicle breakdown and road obstructions ahead).





BUS ZONE

Don't stop or park in a Bus Zone unless you're driving a public bus.



THE SAFETY OF OUR CHILDREN DEPENDS ON US

Traffic rules and parking restrictions are in place to improve everyones' safety.



Parking in a way that blocks buses and crossings or obscures sight lines is illegal, and puts children and motorists at risk.



CHILDREN'S CROSSING

Don't stop within 20m before the crossing and 10m after the crossing.





DOUBLE PARKING

Don't stop on a road between the road centre and another vehicle parked at the side of the road to wait, pick up or drop off passengers.





SPEEDING

Don't exceed 40km/h during the designated school zone hours.



THINK AHEAD - BE PATIENT

Follow the traffic rules within school zones. The cost of taking your children to school depends entirely on you.

Fines current as of 1 July 2024. Fines and demerit points are subject to change.
