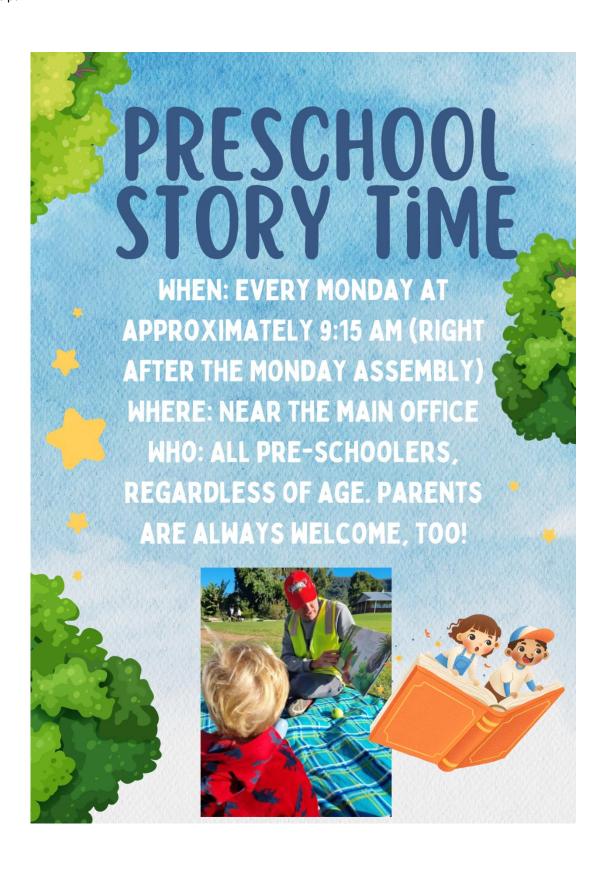
Friday Morning Reading with Mr Hailstone

It's on again! National Simultaneous Storytime and the Scholastic Book Fair will be returning to Mount Terry this term.

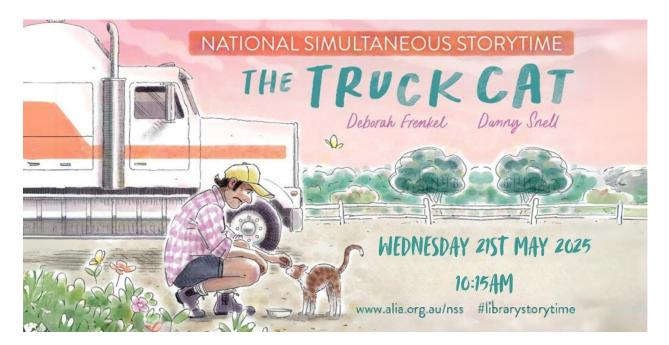
