

We will also advertise our permanent School Administrative Manager (Aboriginal identified) position this Wednesday. If you have strong administrative skills and experience, this may be a great opportunity to join our team.

Additionally, we anticipate advertising a permanent School Learning and Support Officer (SLSO) position during Term 1, 2026, with the successful applicant beginning in Term 2 (Monday 20 April 2026).

ASEAN Bridge Update

We are pleased to share an exciting update on our ASEAN-BRIDGE partnership. Our school has now been officially matched with AUPP High School Foxcroft Academy in Phnom Penh, and we have signed a sister-school agreement to strengthen this connection. The announcement of our partnership was made online in a special ceremony attended by the His Excellency Dr Cheunboran Chanborey, Ambassador of the Kingdom of Cambodia to Australia. Mrs Brosnan has already met with our partner teacher from AUPP High School Mr Radley Martens, who will visit us in 2026.

Early next year, students from both schools will begin connecting through shared classroom activities and online meetings, giving our learners rich opportunities to build friendships, exchange ideas, and experience global citizenship in a meaningful, authentic way.

Preschool Capers

On the 11th of November, our preschool children participated in the Remembrance Day ceremony held at the RSL/Community Shop. To help them understand the significance of the day, we explored the history of Remembrance Day and why it is important to remember those who served.

The children learned about the symbolism of the poppy and rosemary flowers, which are traditionally used on Remembrance Day and ANZAC Day. As a creative activity, they made their own poppies by folding and cutting red paper to wear on the day. They also used yellow and red colours to create unique artworks inspired by war outlines, allowing them to express their reflections on the meaning of the day.

Evidence of our preschool Philosophy.

As Children:

- We explore and engage with our surroundings, which help us: develop an understanding of our place in the world, become active members within the community, grow an appreciation for the natural environment and respect diversity.
- We are learners! We challenge our ideas, knowledge, skills and understandings by engaging in a variety of learning activities, resourcing and designing play experiences indoor and outdoor, and being active participants in our own learning journeys.

As Educators:

- We value an inclusive practice that encompasses a respect for diversity, fairness, and the natural environment. We guide the children, families and community to embrace sustainable practices, adopt an empathetic nature and show respect for diversity. We explore and facilitate a range of opportunities to extend networking by collaborating with the wider community, especially external support and Early Childhood services.
- We embrace the understanding that the environment is the third educator, setting up a variety of learning experiences which appeal to current interest, areas of development and child choice. Our program combines planned curriculum (intentional teaching), spontaneous experiences, key learning areas and Aboriginal Education (Gamilaraay).

Stage 3 Science

Stage 3 have been studying adaptions of plants and animals. Students have made a terrarium last week, and will continue to watch plants grow in a controlled environment, seeing how they adapt.

Students also collected data to see how long simple activities took when they could not use their thumb. We now understand the importance and how we have adapted to use our thumb for so many tasks.



Stage 5 Science

The last couple of weeks have been busy for Stage 5 Science. We have learnt about elements in the periodic table. Students mixed two solutions which formed a precipitate (a solid). Students also created hydrogen gas, proving it with the “pop” test.



On Tuesday the 18th, Year 10, 11 and 12 students had the opportunity to attend a workshop provided by the Office for Youth. Students had a number of interactive sessions to develop their networking and communications skills, whilst strengthening peer connections.

It was an engaging workshop of students discussing what matters most to them and their hopes for the future. Students were able to network with local employers and community representatives who also shared their career journeys. Students were engaged and motivated by discussions and the experiences shared. Larissa was awarded Spark of the Day by peers and received a gift voucher.
