## PRINCIPAL'S message

As we come to the end of Term 3. I'd like to thank our whole school community - students, staff, and families - for a busy and successful term. We've celebrated many highlights, from our choir program and sporting achievements through to classroom learning successes and special events. The support of our parents and carers continues to make a big difference in ensuring our students feel encouraged and cared for at school.

#### **Trialling New Bell Times – Term 4**

Next term, we will be trialling some small changes to our bell times to better support both learning in classrooms and student wellbeing in the playground.

Important for families: the start and finish times for the school day will not change. Drop-off and pick-up remain the same.

At present, some students leave early on buses, which means we lose about 10 minutes of teaching time each day. Our morning session also runs for 2 hours and

25 minutes before students have the chance to eat, which can be a long stretch for many. In addition, we've noticed that our longer breaks are when most negative playground incidents occur.

The trial changes will:

- Give us back valuable learning time across the day.
- Provide earlier opportunities for students to eat and recharge.
- Shorten unstructured breaks and introduce more structured play activities, helping students enjoy safer and more positive playtimes.

It's also important to note that the current policy requirement for students to participate in 150 minutes of physical activity each week will continue to be met. This will be achieved through class-based activities, sport, and physical education programs.

#### Students secure funding in Muswellbrook Shire Council takeover

Muswellbrook Shire Council has given its younger residents the floor, and funding, at an Extraordinary Council Meeting that was also a preview of the upcoming Youth Council.

In a curtain-raiser to the Muswellbrook Youth Council that will meet from 2026, school students used the Extraordinary Meeting to pitch Councillors for a \$500 grant.

Students from Muswellbrook Public, Muswellbrook South Public, Denman Public, Sandy Hollow Public, Martindale Public, St James' Primary, St Joseph's Denman, Pacific Brook Christian School, St Joseph's Aberdeen, Scone Grammar School and Muswellbrook High all lobbied the Mayor, elected Council and senior staff.

Their wish list included new digital bells, school bike racks and classroom laptops. Councillors asked questions, assessed each pitch against community benefit criteria and finally resolved to fund all 11 projects on the spot in a \$5,500 commitment.

Muswellbrook Mayor Jeff Drayton said the Extraordinary Meeting showed the full Youth Council will work as a forum for the Shire's young people.

"If these kids were nervous, we couldn't tell - they were organised, confident and thoughtful in their presentations to the elected Council. They identified needs within their schools, gave reasons and even handled a bit of scrutiny," Mayor Drayton said.

"It's certainly not easy to speak in a formal setting, and this meeting was a reminder our young people have plenty to offer. If these are our future community leaders and participants, Muswellbrook Shire is in good hands."

While the Extraordinary Meeting was official, from 2026 the Muswellbrook Youth Council will carry a bigger remit. The body will promote youth wellbeing and leadership, as well as events and campaigns driven by Muswellbrook young people.

Two representatives from each primary and high school will meet to discuss concerns, propose solutions and make recommendations to the full Muswellbrook Shire Council.

Students can also take part in full Council meetings, receive mentoring from the Mayor, Councillors and Governance staff, and help plan community events under the Youth Council's 2026 budget.

Youth Council facilitator, and Council Manager Governance and Risk, Katie Hamm said the Extraordinary Meeting was a positive step for the program.

"The Youth Council will be a standing advisory body. We'll invite representatives from every local primary and high school to meet quarterly with Councillors and staff. They'll learn how budgets work, give feedback on parks, footpaths, youth programs and even co-design events and facilities," Ms Hamm said.

"This Extraordinary Meeting was about showing Muswellbrook Shire young people they can shape decisions and see the results in their own lives."

Council plans to rotate Youth Council meetings between Muswellbrook and Denman, livestream selected sessions to the public, and publish reports.




## GREEN TEAM

## ... SCHOOL BYTES

#### **SCHOOL BYTES**

Muswellbrook South Public School uses School Bytes for our finance system and for emailing notes etc. You can access School Bytes either via the Parent Portal website or via the School Bytes app (NEW).



School Bytes parent portal enables you to view all your children in one portal and process payments for multiple siblings in one transaction.

Once your portal is activated you can use it to give consent for events and process online payments.

#### To make an online payment -

- **1. Log into the parent portal** <a href="https://portal.schoolbytes.education/auth/login">https://portal.schoolbytes.education/auth/login</a> or via School Bytes App.
- 2. Select the statement of account icon.
- 3. Select the charges to pay.

By default, all the students linked to your account will be displayed, select a student's name to view the charges linked with that student.

If the charge is related to an activity consent must be given before making payment.

- 4. Confirm or edit the balance to be paid for each charge (if required).
- 5. Optionally select 'add other item' to add a sundry item (e.g. Year 6 graduation souvenir) that is not linked to the statement of account. When adding a new sundry item, select the relevant student.
- 6. Select pay now (optionally select pay with saved credit card details if previously saved).
- 7. Review payment details.
- **9. Select pay.** You will be redirected to a secure Service NSW payment page to enter your credit/debit card details to finalise payment.
- **10. Payment successful.** Click anywhere outside the receipt prompt to return to the parent portal. A receipt will be automatically emailed to you.

Cash payments can still be made at school. Please note receipts for these cash payments will be emailed to the email address held on file at school. Please contact the school if you need to update your email address.

## SCHOOL BYTES

If you are a parent/carer using an Outlook email address (i.e. @outlook.com, @hotmail.com, @live.com.au) and you're not receiving emails from your child's school sent through School Bytes or if the emails are going to the junk folder you can follow the steps below to add School Bytes to your Outlook safe senders list.


1. From your Outlook home page, select the 'Settings' cog in the top right corner of the menu bar.



2. Select the 'View all Outlook settings' link at the bottom of the panel.



3. Select the 'Junk email' heading.



4. Select the blue '+ Add' button from the 'Safe senders and domains' heading. A text input box will show.



5. Type in the email address — noreply@mail.schoolbytes.education



- 6. Once the email address has been typed in, press 'Enter' on your keyboard.
- 7. Select the blue 'Save' button.



Any future emails sent by your child's school through School Bytes will now go directly to your 'Inbox' folder.


