
Students may access ABC Reading Eggs as part of their literacy rotation tasks at school and are welcome to practise their skills at home.

# 5/6 TURTLES









### **Mathematics**

5/6 Turtles have have been deepening their understanding of decimal place value and ordering decimals through hands-on activities. Using stopwatches, they attempted to stop the timer at exactly 3 seconds, recording and ordering their results from closest to furthest from 3 seconds. They then applied their learning in PE, timing each other completing an activity and recording times to the thousandth of a second. A fun and practical way to see decimals in action!

### **Creative Arts**

Students have been exploring the art of portrait photography, learning how to frame, focus, and capture expressive images of their peers. They put their new skills to the test by photographing a classmate. Student also used different techniques to create their own unique impressions of a turtle. Using colour, texture, and creativity, they brought their visions to life. Their amazing artworks, along with their photographs, were entered into Nabiac Show.




















## POSITIVE

- Fairness




### Add a splash of rainbow




### **P&C Meeting**
