Cross Country



The Cross Country will be held on the 28th of March (weather and grounds permitting) for all students from Kindergarten to Year 6. The event will start in the morning after roll call and run until lunchtime. The races will start with the youngest age groups.

Students run in the age group that they will turn this year. The distance of the race varies according to the age of the students. Five and six year old students will run a shortened course. Seven year olds will run 1 lap. Eight and nine year olds run in the same race, running 2 laps. Ten year olds run 2 laps. Students that are eleven and twelve years old both run 3 laps (in separate events). We will use the race time of these events to determine the results of the 1500m for the Athletics Carnival and determine the zone representative for 1500m. The results will become part of the competition for the Athletics Carnival later in Term 2. This prevents the need to run a very similar event in a close period of time. The winners will be drawn after the Easter Hat Parade on Friday the 11th April.






