Dear Parents and Carers,


Welcome to Week 4!

Athletics Carnival Lunch Orders



In the Classroom with 3/4 Meerkats





BANANA PIKELETS 30 SERVES

INGREDIENTS

- . 1 over ripe banana, mashed
- · 1 cup wholemeal self-raising
- · 1 egg
- . 3/4 cup milk
- · 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence (optional)
- · Olive oil spray

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Sift flour into a bowl.
- 2. Add egg and milk and whisk until batter is
- 3. Add mashed banana and stir to combine.
- 4. Heat a non-stick frypan on medium heat and lightly spray with olive oil.
- 5. Place heaped tablespoons of batter in the pan and cook for 2 to 3 minutes or until bubbles appear on the surface of each pikelet.
- 6. Gently flip and cook for another 1 to 2 minutes or until golden brown.
- 7. Place pikelets on a plate lined with baking paper and continue to cook until no batter remains.


