The Australian Guidelines recommend **no more than 2 hours** of recreational screen time (not including schoolwork) for children aged 5-17.

- · Having screen-free zones, like bedrooms and at mealtimes
- · Encouraging outdoor play or hands-on games
- · Modelling positive screen behaviour as adults

Stay Healthy this Winter

As we enter the winter season, respiratory viruses such as influenza, also known as flu, are expected to rise.

NSW Health has a number of resources to support you and your family this winter:



Book your families fly Vaccination

<u>Book your family's flu vaccination</u> (External link) for the best protection from getting sick. Recommended for everyone aged 6 months and over. Stay informed about <u>vaccinations</u> (External link) and access <u>translated vaccine information</u> (External link).



Help Stop the Spread:

Help stop the spread of cold and flu by practicing good general hygiene including:

- regular handwashing for at least 20 seconds (Need a timer? Get your child to hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice);
- · using hand sanitiser;
- · covering coughs and sneezes;
- cleaning frequently touched surfaces, particularly when people are sick; and
- not visiting people who are at higher risk of severe illness if you have cold or flu symptoms, especially babies and older people.





Call for Advice

Call <u>healthdirect</u> (External Link) on 1800 022 222 for free health advice, care and treatment for non-life threatening conditions from a registered nurse. They can find you a nearby doctor, pharmacist, urgent care service or connect you to specialist virtual care.






Stay home

Your child will need to stay home, if they are sick with multiple or severe respiratory symptoms, symptoms that are worsening, or other signs like fever, rash, or tiredness. Please let us know as soon as possible if your child is sick, absent or needs to attend a medical appointment during school hours. Our teachers are here to help your child's continued learning and return to school once they are well enough.





THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

Uniforms and School Hats

The uniform shop is open on Tuesday mornings from 8:45 AM to 9:15 AM. Orders can be placed via Spriggy or in person, and both cash and card payments are accepted.

School hats are available for purchase at the front office for \$7.

Please remember that Friday is sports day, and students are required to wear their sports uniform. Sports club jumpers may be worn on this day only.

Riding Bikes to School

If your child is riding a bike, scooter or skateboard to school, they must walk them through the school grounds. There is a bike rack behind the Library where they are to remain until 3pm. Helmets can be taken with their bags into the classroom.

Medical Certificates

If your child is away for more than two days, it is a requirement to provide a medical certificate.



Responding on School Bytes

Our school uses School Bytes for attendance, parent communication, and event management. If there is an event and your child will not be attending, please remember to respond with 'not going.' This helps us plan effectively.

Extended Leave Form

If you are planning a holiday or will be away for 4 days or more, please complete an Extended Leave Form. These forms are available in the Office or can be emailed to you upon request.

Please ensure to provide proof of travel, such as an accommodation receipt or airfare confirmation. Once approved you will receive a certificate to take with you.

School Arrival Time

Students are asked not to arrive before 8:30am as there are no teachers on duty until 8:30am.

By ensuring that students arrive after 8:30am, we can maintain a safe and secure environment for everyone. The school staff will be available to assist students with any questions they may have and to ensure a smooth start to their day.
