

Public Education Week Open Classrooms and Assembly




















In the Classroom with 5/6 Pelicans

The 5/6 Pelicans have been busy crafting creative ideas in preparation for our upcoming Father's Day writing. We've shared some lively conversations about our dads - describing their unique personalities, the things we love doing together, and even their most common sayings around the house!

In **English**, we're exploring the world of digital texts, learning how to analyse and evaluate their credibility. We've discussed how to identify whether a text is written by someone with authority or if it might be fake news. Students have been introduced to the concepts of **objective** and **subjective** language and have practised writing their own sentences to demonstrate both.

This semester in **Geography**, we are exploring the many factors that shape our environment. Our focus has shifted to understanding various **biomes** around the world and comparing them to those found in Australia. To deepen our understanding, we're integrating this topic into **Creative Arts**, where students are working on artworks that depict a **desert biome**.

It's been an engaging few weeks in the 5/6 Pelicans classroom!
