



# 5/6 Pelicans


The Pelicans have been exploring Worse Things by Sally Murphy, a free verse novel, and experimenting with various punctuation techniques—such as brackets, square brackets, commas, and dashes—to enhance their writing. They've been using punctuation to add parenthesis [more information], creating more interesting writing.


In science, Pelicans have been investigating how computers represent and process information through binary code. They've translated numbers into binary, decoded binary codes to create emojis, and successfully crafted secret messages using ASCII code.


Additionally, they've started their Dance Unit, This Is Me from The Greatest Showman, which has helped them connect the art of dance with storytelling, deepening their understanding of both.






Thanks to our amazing P&C, breakfast will be available for the riders - and the fundraiser will help support our school!

# 5/6 Turtles Poetry

5/6 Turtles have been exploring the book Worse Things by Sally Murphy. They have been inspired by her use of definition poems, which are woven throughout the novel. After studying how Murphy used precise word choice and creative punctuation to build rhythm and meaning, students selected their own focus word and write definition poems of their own. Each poem reflects their unique perspectives, with carefully chosen synonyms and punctuation that create flow and feeling.


