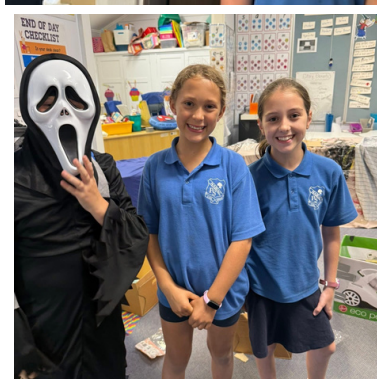
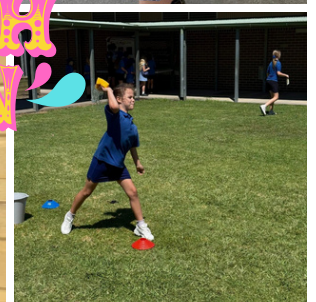
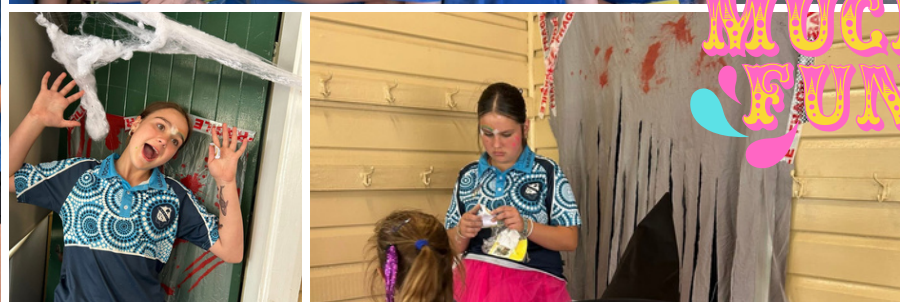
INDIGENOUS BREAKFAST & TRANSITION

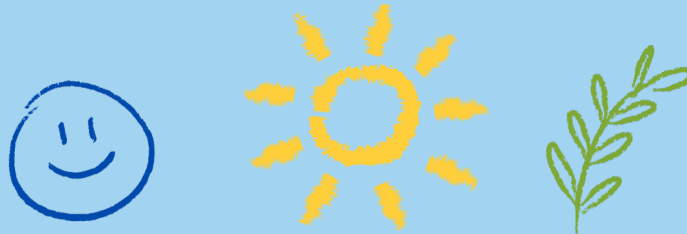


Year 6 Fun Day

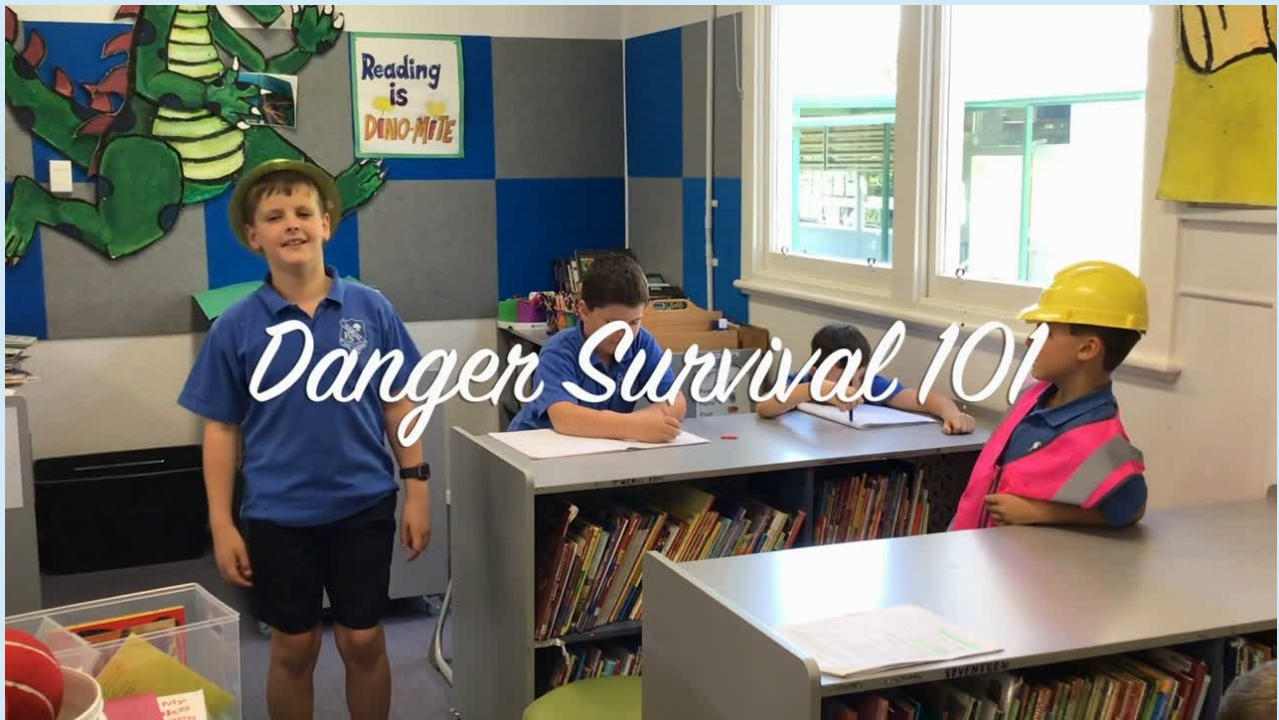
