Sporting Pathways

In addition to school sport there are a lot of sporting opportunities within the sporting pathways of NSW public schools. With so many trials and gala days occurring we would like to clarify for our families what each of the opportunities are.

<u>Gala days</u> – These are an opportunity to represent and participate in school sport for enjoyment without the pressure of competition. These days are generally held throughout our representative district of Gobondery NARRAF and include sports such as touch football, netball, cricket and soccer. These days are valuable in developing skills in particular sports.

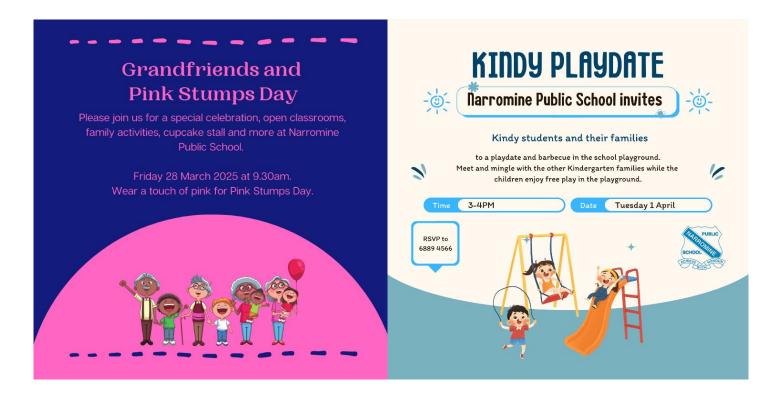
<u>Representative Sport –</u> This opportunity is open to students aged 8-13 in primary years. This is offered in multiple team sports in addition to the three sporting carnivals of swimming, athletics and cross country. Students are selected at a

school level to compete against other students in the Gobonery NARRAF region. Students who gain selection into the Gobondery NARRAF team then trial for Western representation. On occasions students will be put forward directly for trial at Western level. If selected for Western representation students compete against other students from across NSW at State carnivals. From here students are able to be selected to represent NSW at School Sport Australia Championships, where representatives from across Australia compete.

<u>PSSA Knockout</u> – These teams are selected at a school level and compete in a knockout competition against other schools in the greater area. Team advancement in the competition is dependent on winning games.
