Class Spotlight KM

Our school's littlest learners continue to have fun learning at school.

In mathematics, students have been exploring concepts with lots of hands-on activities. Using the new Fairy Garden sand, they used the terms full, empty and half full to describe the contents of containers. They learnt that objects can have the same volume but look different. They also built models with different volumes and challenged a partner to replicate the models.

To investigate the concept of area, students have designed different sized wallaby caves, and they have compared which water 'splat' has the largest area. What is superimposing? Does the shape of the container affect how much water it can hold? How can we describe the area of the splats? These are just some of the questions students have been answering as they learn that maths is everywhere.

Kindergarten has also been learning in science about the properties of different materials, such as cardboard, wood and metal. They have been discovering that everyday items are made from materials to help suit their purpose. Furniture made from cardboard is not very strong, although it is cheap, light and can be recycled (like the Paris Olympic athlete beds).

KM show curiosity in everything they do, not just in maths and science. Every day it's a joy to watch these young


