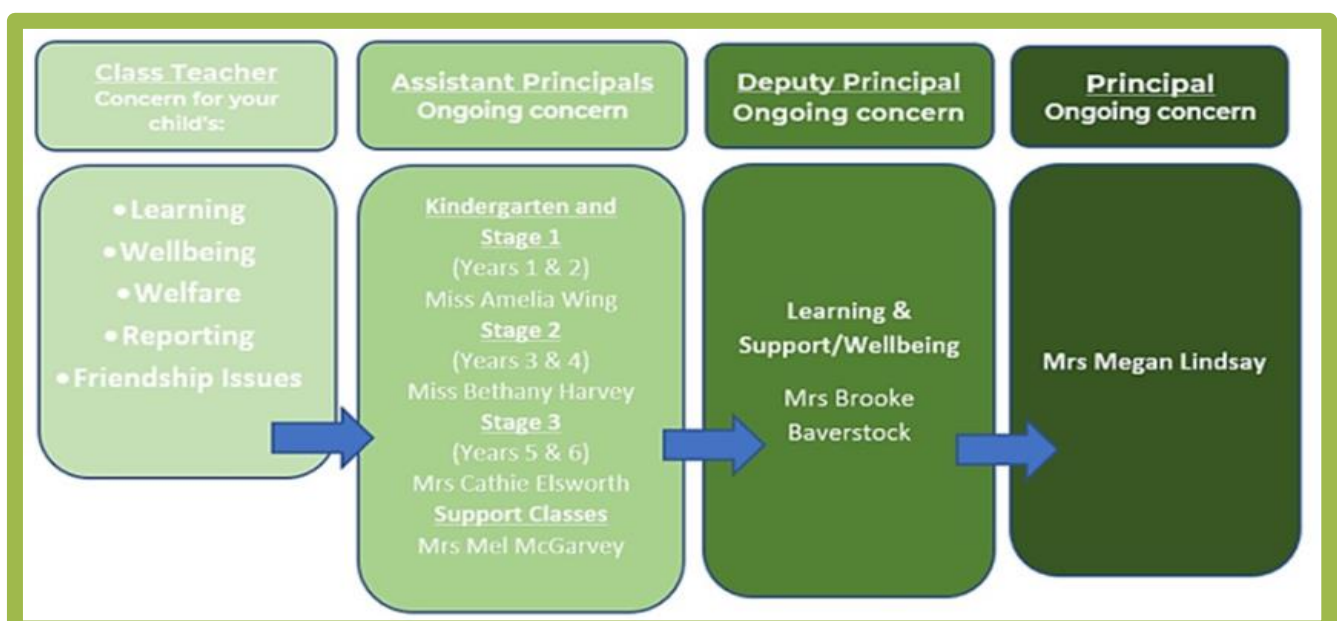
Communication with the School

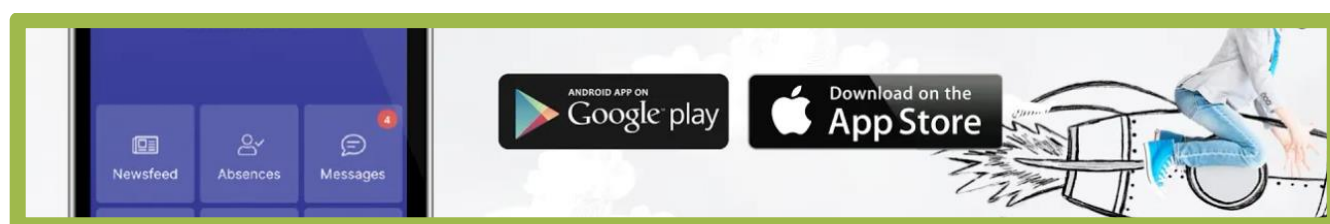
The Parent Portal is designed for your convenience, allowing you to oversee your child's school journey effortlessly from any device. It's browser-based, so it works on any device with an internet browser!

PBL Expectations

This term we have revamped our Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) expectations. We have designed all our lessons to be revisited, and we are providing regular reminders just before each break. All our focus areas fall under our whole school expectations of Respectful, Safe, Learner. So far, we have focused on Kind words, Right place right time, Safe hands and feet, and Respectful. Each focus area is displayed around the school, and it is posted on Facebook for our parents to be aware of.

Students who are following our school expectations are rewarded within their classrooms by their class teacher and are given Storkie tickets in the playground. Students place their Storkie ticket in their house Storkie box located between the office door and the canteen. There is 1 box per house. Students can find out their house colour from their class teacher if they are unsure. The winning house will get first choice of the activities being held on our end of term reward session. There will be sport activities, Easter craft, science experiments or a Movie as the activities offered in the reward session which will be held on the last day of this term.

As an extra special treat, students who have consistently demonstrated all three expectations, Respectful, Safe, Learner, may be lucky enough to be chosen to attend Morning or Afternoon tea with the Principal, Mrs Lindsay. This is only offered to a limited number of students each term. This term, the lucky students enjoyed an ice cream with Mrs Lindsay.

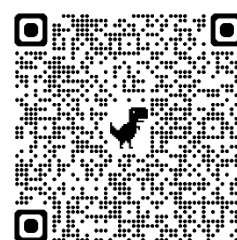

Behaviour Code

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive, and responsive learning environments for everyone across a range of settings. We teach and model the inclusive and safe behaviours we value in our students. The students at Northlakes Public School have been shown and have had discussions about the Behaviour Code in their classrooms. It identifies our 3 PBL expectations of being respectful, safe learners and addresses the expectations within each area.

Healthcare Plans

All students are entitled to participate in education regardless of their health support needs. While a student's health support rests primarily with the parent, school staff have a duty to keep students safe while they are at school or are involved in school activities.

Schools are expected to consult with parents about their child's health. When students need help with health issues at school, parents may need to consult with their medical practitioner about the implications of the child's health condition for their schooling and any actions that need to occur during the school day. Parents need to convey relevant information from the medical practitioner to the principal in writing.

Schools undertake collaborative individual health support planning to determine the best way for the individual health needs to be met. This may require the principal to seek additional support from the department so that appropriate arrangements can be made for the student's participation at school. Northlakes Public School reviews and updates all student health care needs at the beginning of each academic year. It's essential to submit any required documentation to ensure we can support your student effectively. Additionally, please inform the office if there are any changes to your student's health care during the school year.

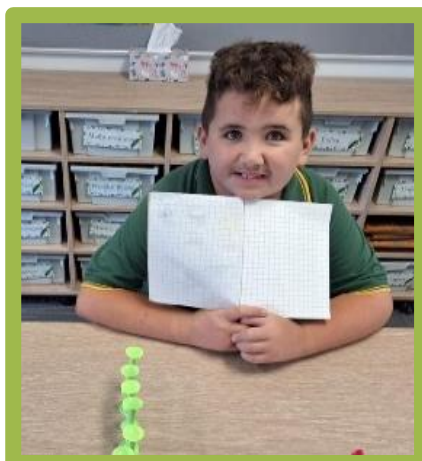
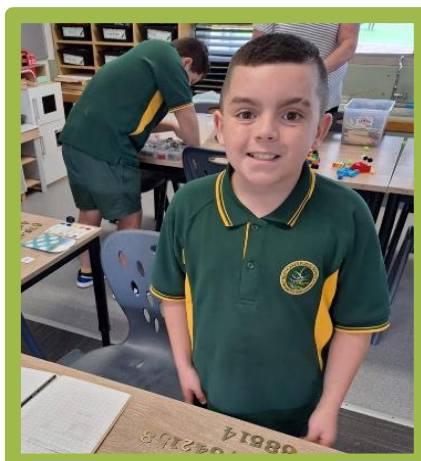
It was truly heartwarming to see students proudly dressed in orange, showcasing the colours of their class's chosen country or wearing attire that represented their own cultural heritage.

Although no one advanced to the next level, we want to highlight Auburn and Cooper for reaching the finals in the 50m freestyle for their respective age groups.

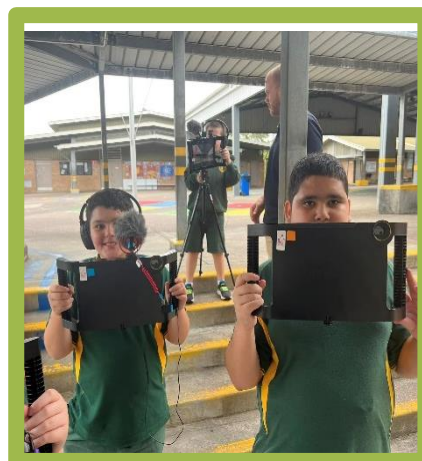


News From the Support Classroom

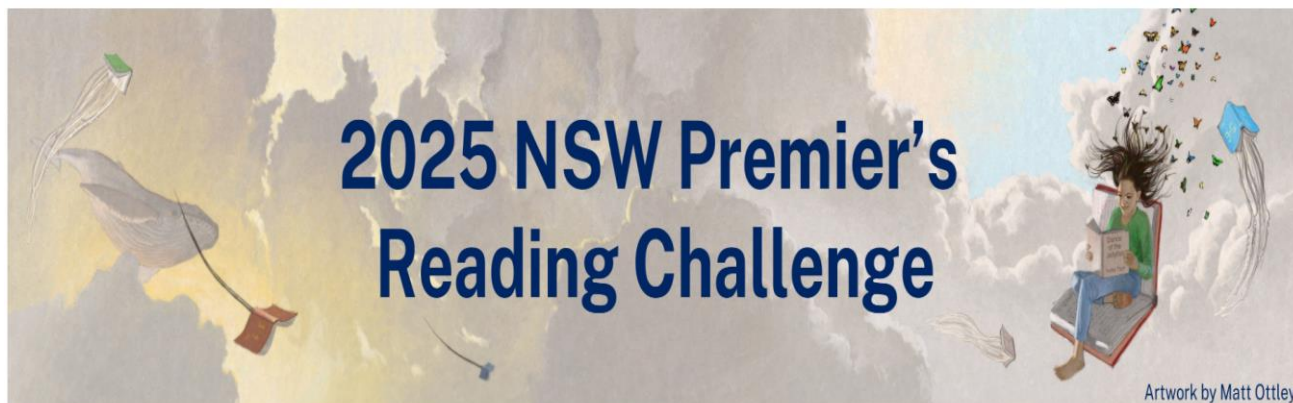

2025 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge is now open and Northlakes Public School is excited to be participating!

What is the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge?

The PRC is a statewide Challenge that encourages students to develop a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students and enables them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition, but a challenge to encourage each student to read, to read more, and to read more widely.

All students who complete the challenge and have their reading record validated by the school's PRC coordinator will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.

How many books do students need to read?

Students in Kindergarten to Year 2 are challenged to read or experience 30 books. 20 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books. Books can be read with a parent, carer, teacher or another student.

Students in Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 20 books independently. At least 10 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books.

If a book is from an approved PRC series, students can enter up to 5 books as Challenge books, and can read up to 10 other books from the same series as Personal Choice books. More information on the rules of the Challenge can be found [on the PRC website](#).

Books must be added to a student's online reading record by **Friday 22 August 2025** in order for their reading record to be validated and receive a certificate.

How do students log their reading?

Students can access the PRC's [Student Experience site](#) using their DoE username and password, or can log into the site via the Student Portal. A video guide explaining how to use the Student Experience site can be found [here](#).

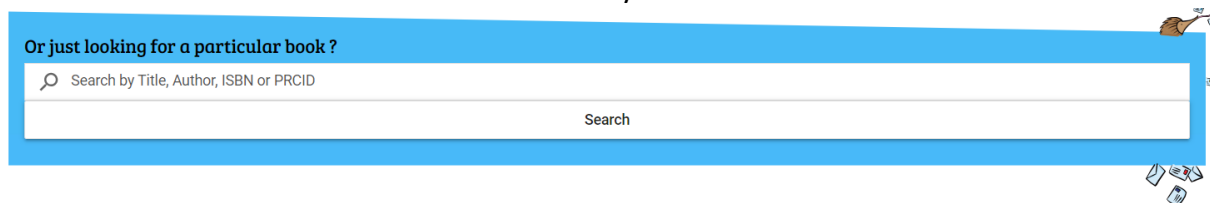
Students may also record their reading on the Personal Reading Log and submit it to the PRC Coordinator by 23 August 2024, who will complete the reading log on the students' behalf.

How can students find books on the NSW PRC challenge lists?

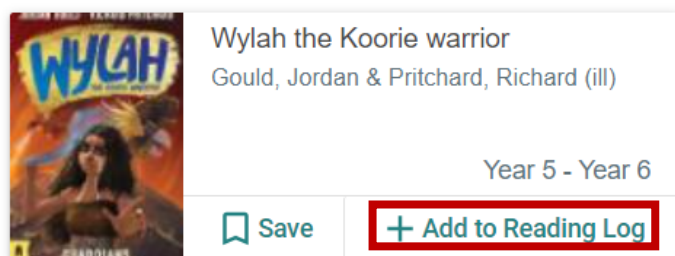
The Northlakes Public School library contains lots of books that can count towards the challenge. These books are identified with red (K-2), green (3-4) and purple (5-6) stickers.

A quick guide for logging books:

1. Log into the [Student experience site](#) using your DoE student username and password.
2. Use the blue search bar to search for books you have read.



2a. If the title appears, click “Add to Reading Log” to add it as a PRC book.



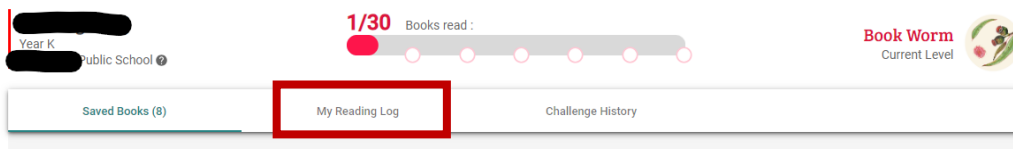
2b. If the title does not appear, you will need to enter it as a personal choice book.

To enter a personal choice book:

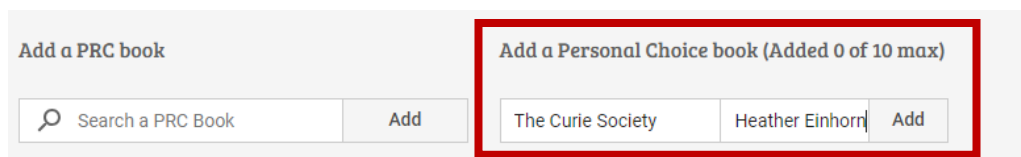
1. Click on the icon in the top right hand corner:

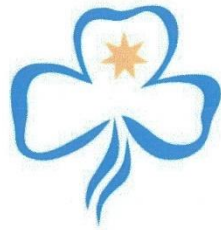

Busways: Tap On and Tap Off

Important information if your child travels to school by bus?

From 24 February to 21 March 2025 Transport for NSW will be focusing on school student Opal tap data to help plan better bus services.

It's vital that your child remembers to tap on and tap off their Student or Child/Youth Opal card during this time – and every time they travel by bus.

Why is tapping on and off on the bus important?

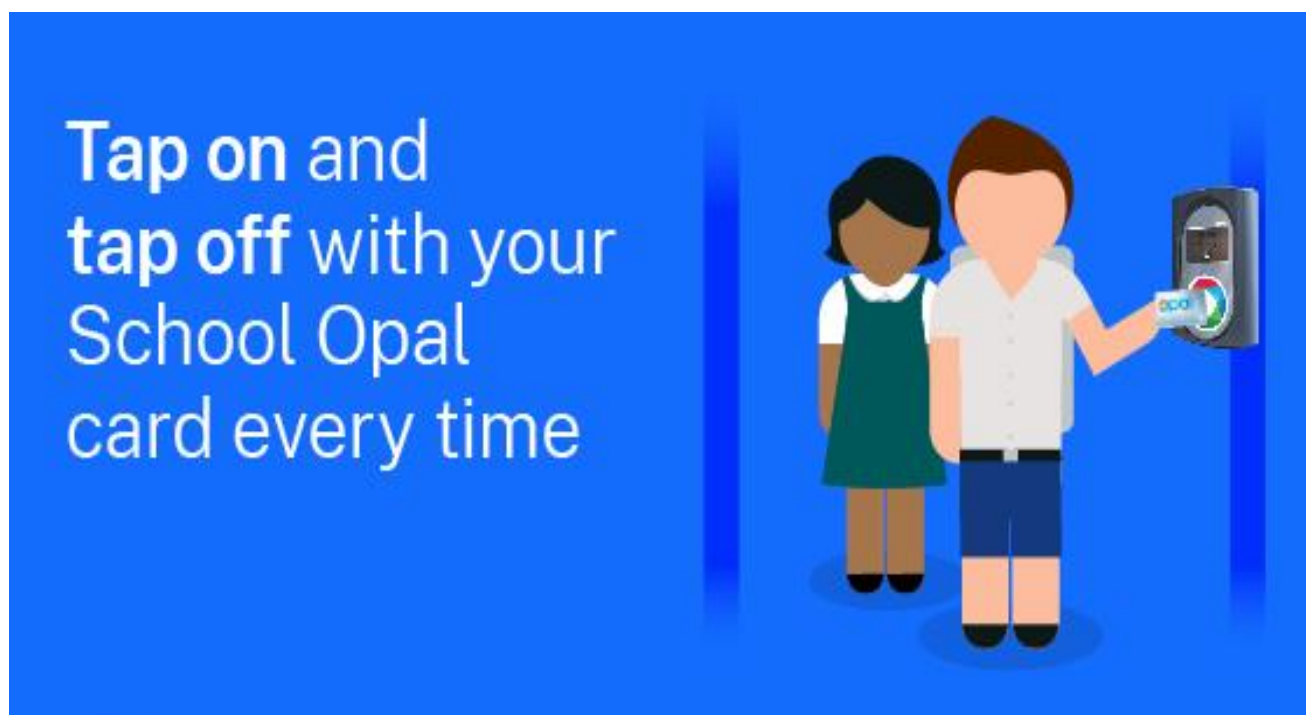
The use of Opal cards is the primary way bus operators and Transport for NSW analyse demand for bus services. When students don't use their Opal cards, their trip is not recorded. Therefore, buses may appear underutilised. Tapping on and off provides better data to plan better bus services.

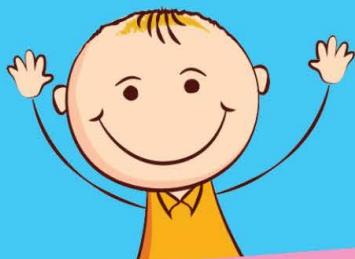
How can you help?

Please remind your child to tap on and off and ensure your child has a valid Opal card (either a School or Child/Youth Opal card) and remind them to tap on and tap off on every trip. To apply for a school Opal card, visit <https://transportnsw.info/school-travel-apply>.

Students may see onboard bus posters and Busways Community Relation Officers at afternoon loadings.

Together let's get students into good habits of tapping on and tapping off with their Opal card.

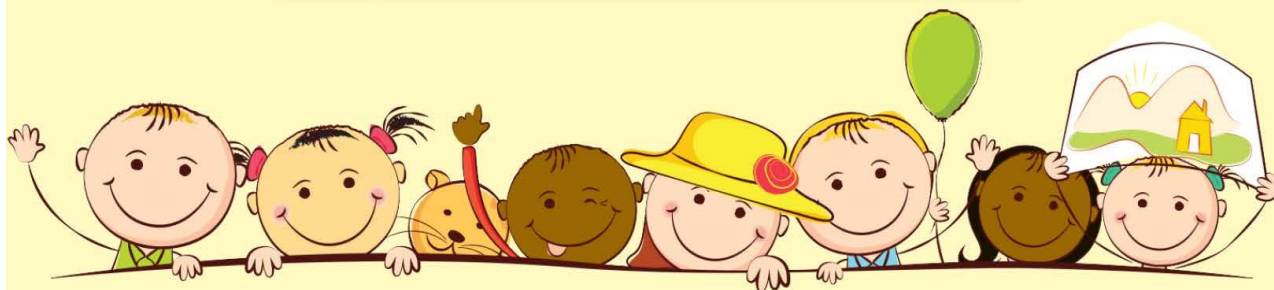
