
Exploring Culture Through Rhythm: Year 7 PBL on Australian Identity

This term, Year 7 students completed a Project-Based Learning (PBL) task exploring the theme of Australian Identity. Working in groups, students composed and performed original rhythm cycles using percussion instruments, supported by notated posters that highlighted the key musical elements of their compositions.

The project encouraged students to express their ideas about Australian culture in both creative and collaborative ways. In doing so, they reflected several principles of the High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE) framework, including:


- Original thinking and creativity in composing unique rhythm cycles.
- Collaboration and communication through rehearsals and group decision-making.
- Curiosity and deep engagement in exploring cultural themes through music.
- Problem-solving and persistence in refining and notating their musical ideas.

By combining performance with notation, students were able to demonstrate both their practical skills and their theoretical understanding of music. The project highlighted the value of teamwork, creativity, and cultural exploration, while also building students' confidence and extending their learning through authentic performance experiences.









Life is a Circus at Northmead

Since 2018, Northmead Creative and Performing Arts High School has been proud to be among a select number of schools in NSW to offer Circus as both a curriculum subject and extracurricular opportunity. What began as a bold addition to the CAPA program has grown into a thriving strand of our creative community.

Today, Circus is offered as an Endeavour Elective for Years 7–8, a NESA-approved Elective for Years 9–10, and through an after-school ensemble. Students train in the art of aerial and ground circus as well as acrobatics, developing technical precision, resilience, and creativity. The program goes beyond physical training. Students gain a deeper understanding of the body in motion, circus training methods, and the Australian circus industry. They explore performance elements, technical production skills, and the historical traditions that shape circus arts today.

Each year, Circus students present their own Circus Showcase, where they demonstrate the incredible skills, originality, and artistry they have developed, sharing their passion and talent with the wider school community.







Circus exemplifies the HPGE framework by combining physical, creative, and intellectual domains—challenging students to push boundaries, take risks, and shine in a unique performance art form that is truly one of a kind.



Taking the Stage: Dance & Music Showcase at Riverside Theatre

In June 2025, our Dance and Music students took to the stage at Riverside Theatre, Parramatta, for the annual Mid-Year Showcase. For many of our performers, Riverside has become a second home—an inspiring professional venue where they have grown in confidence and skill since their first performances in Year 7. As Year 11 Dance students **Sebastian, Lily, and Ella reflected**, "Each experience has been incredibly rewarding, giving us not only the thrill of being on stage but also a glimpse into what it's like to perform in professional venues. These opportunities have shaped our growth as dancers and deepened our passion for the art."

The Showcase brought together a wide variety of performances, allowing students to share their learning with family, friends, and the school community. It also highlighted key principles of the High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE) framework. Students demonstrated:

Bringing Stories to Life: Drama Mid-Year Showcase at The Lennox

In June 2025, Drama students took to the stage at The Lennox – Riverside Theatre, performing a diverse range of scenes and scripted works. The Showcase highlighted the growth of students as actors, while giving them the unique experience of performing in a professional theatre environment.

The evening reflected core principles of the High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE) framework, particularly within the Creative domain. Students demonstrated:

- **Originality and innovation** in their interpretations of characters and scripts.
- Curiosity and engagement as they explored complex ideas through performance.
- **Persistence and commitment** throughout rehearsals and preparation.
- Advanced communication skills in conveying meaning clearly to an audience.

By applying classroom learning in an authentic context, students not only developed confidence as performers, but also gained an appreciation for the discipline and teamwork required in live theatre. The Showcase was a powerful reminder of the creativity and commitment our Drama students bring to their craft.
