School Hats and Sun Safety

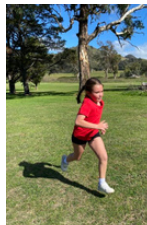
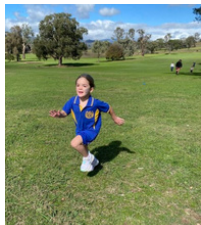

Isabelle and Jensen have been working on building little houses using paddlepop sticks, craft resources and their creative imaginations.

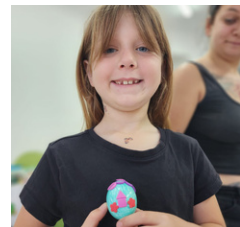
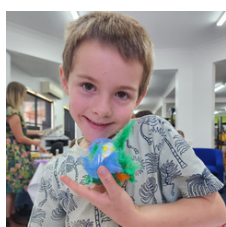


We were lucky and got a visit from some beautiful little chicks that belong to Maisy.

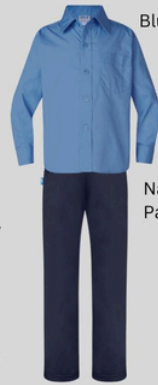

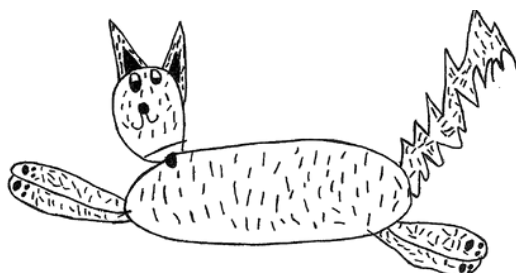
