On Monday 15th September, students travelled to Quirindi Public School for an Aboriginal Cultural Day. The students participated in a smoking ceremony and then enjoyed Miss Tay reading them a story. Ochre painting of faces followed and the visit culminated with a barbecue lunch in the park. We would like to thank Tommy Taylor, Miss Tay, Mrs Cracknell and Tamworth Aboriginal Medical Service and their volunteers for the activities provided. The students enjoyed the day, the activities and mixing with the other students from Quirindi.

Language Lessons

This week we were lucky to be joined by Lenny Waters for our language lessons. Lenny was able to share his vast knowledge of Aboriginal Language and Culture with the students. Lenny showed the students how he made a coolamon, the shaping of the bark, the sanding and smoothing of the coolamon and told of how these coolamons were used to carry food, babies and even people over water, if they were large enough. Lenny also spoke to the students about the stories in the star constellations. We thank Lenny for joining us, I have heard Lenny speak several times as a teacher, but the more I hear him speak the more I am still learning about this land that we live work and play on.

AFL

The AFL lessons have continued and by the laughing, giggles and cheering the students are really enjoying these lessons. We thank Lachie and Simon for coming each week to help the students improve their skills in AFL.

CAPERS

After the holidays our school will be performing in CAPERS (Creative Arts in Public Education Regional Spectacular). Our students will be performing in the Small School item. The performances are Friday 7th November and Saturday 8th November. 





Healthy screen habits

Screens are part of modern life, but too much screen time can affect sleep, mood, concentration, learning and physical activity.

The Australian Guidelines recommend **no more than 2 hours** of recreational screen time (not including schoolwork) for children aged 5-17.

- · Having screen-free zones, like bedrooms and at mealtimes
- · Encouraging outdoor play or hands-on games
- Modelling positive screen behaviour as adults
