PRINCIPAL REPORT

Gamilaraay Language Lessons

Yaama! This fortnight, our students have continued their language learning sessions with Ness from the Winanga-li Gamilaraay Language Hub. Our current focus is Dhawun, which means "the land." Students have been discovering Gamilaraay words related to the land, including bagay (river), yarral (rock), gali (water), and dhulu (tree). We look forward to deepening our understanding of dhawun and expanding our knowledge of the Gamilaraay language in the weeks ahead.

Biodiversity Day

Last week, Wes Leedham from the Warrumbungle National Park Environmental Education Centre led an exciting day dedicated to biodiversity. Throughout the day, our students rotated through three engaging sessions. One involved building "frog hotels" with the help of Wes and Pete from the Royal Botanic Garden Sydney, designed to encourage frogs to inhabit our ponds and support them in managing an irritating bacterium. We were also fortunate to welcome Bill and Kez from Taronga Zoo, who brought along some special guests including Fish, a magnificent tree frog; Philomena, a spiny leaf insect; Grendel, a blue tongue lizard; Minn, a spotted python; and Tommy, a ringtail possum. Additionally, Mrs Price guided students in starting a garden mural project, which will continue to develop over the coming months.

Book Week

One of the highlights of the year! Our annual Book Week celebrations were a wonderful success once again. It was heartwarming to see so many family and community members join us, including our preschool friends and younger siblings who loved participating in the parade. 


