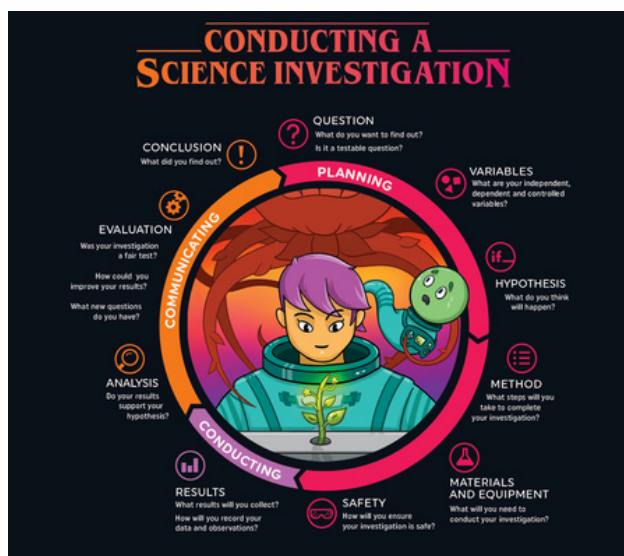

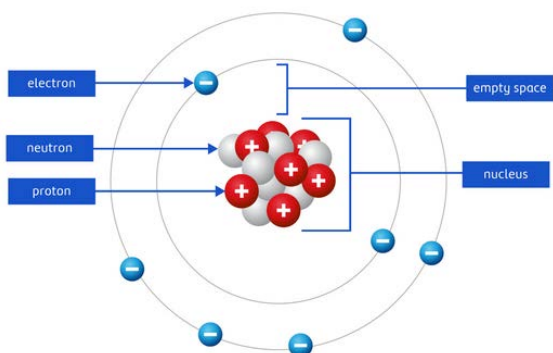
SCHOOL NEWSLETTER: EXCITING DEVELOPMENTS IN STAGE 4/5 SCIENCE AND PDHPE

Stage 4 Science: Independent Research Projects

Our Stage 4 Science students are currently embarking on an exciting journey of discovery through independent research projects. Under the guidance of Miss Elith, students are exploring topics ranging from reaction times to chemical reaction rates. 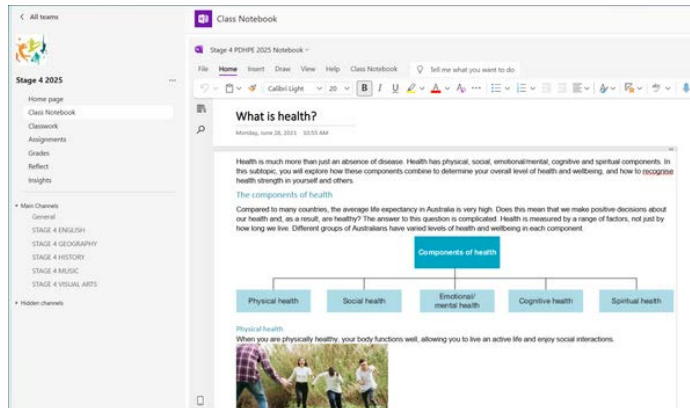
Stage 5 Science: Understanding Atoms



Stage 5 Science classes are currently focused on the fundamental building blocks of matter - atoms. Students are learning about atomic structure, including protons, neutrons, and electrons, and how these components interact to form elements and compounds. Through interactive lessons, students are developing a deeper understanding of how matter behaves and the significance of atoms in the natural world. Stage 4 PDHPE: Health and Wellbeing

In Stage 4 PDHPE, students are exploring the vital elements of health and wellbeing. 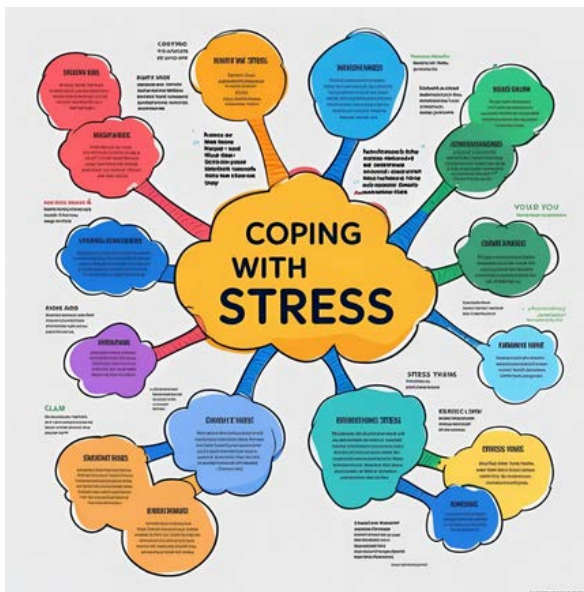


Stage 5 PDHPE: Responding to Life's Changes

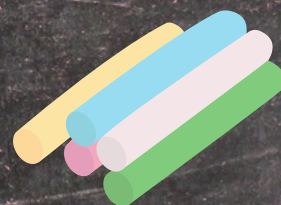
