Principal Report

Dear Parents, Carers, and Community Members,

As we move through Week 4, it has been wonderful to see the engaging activities taking place at our school. One highlight last fortnight was the Yanco Creek and Tributaries committee BioBlitz program in Jerilderie, where secondary students engaged enthusiastically with local biodiversity, exploring and learning about our natural environment. Experiences like these not only enrich our science curriculum but also foster a deep connection and respect for nature.

Our Student Representative Council (SRC) continues to bring joy to the school community with their Singing and Cooking Lunch Clubs. These clubs have become popular lunchtime activities that encourage teamwork, creativity, and a sense of belonging. It's heartening to see students developing their confidence and new skills outside the classroom setting.

Last week's Grandparents Day was a special occasion filled with warmth and celebration. The spoken word poetry performances by our students were particularly impressive, showcasing their creativity and confidence in public speaking while honouring the important role grandparents play in our lives. Furthermore we saw a number of students sharing their special talents through a short skit on stage. Well done students!

Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributes funding to our school in the amount of \$90 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

I would also like to take this opportunity to discuss our OCS rewards system. This program recognises students who demonstrate positive behaviour, consistent learning, regular attendance and wearing school uniform. It is designed to motivate and celebrate achievements while promoting a respectful, inclusive school culture. We encourage all students to strive for excellence and to make positive choices daily. We look forward to celebrating with students who have consistently done these things all semester at the rewards day on the last day of term.

Additionally, we cannot overstate the importance of regular attendance. Consistent attendance plays a critical role in student success, ensuring continuity in learning and development. We ask parents and carers to support their children in attending school every day unless unwell, as every lesson counts towards building knowledge and skills.

Finally, a few tips for supporting your child's learning at home:

- Promote a growth mindset by praising persistence and resilience.


Thank you for your continued support and partnership in your child's education. Together, we can ensure that every student thrives both at school and beyond.

MATHEMATICS

This term both Stage 4 and 5 Mathematics have been looking at data. Stage 4 have been calculating mean, median and mode and looking at the different ways in which types of data is graphed and analysed. Stage 5 dropped different types of balls 15 times from a 1 metre height and recorded the bounce height. They then used Excel to record and display their data in box plots.



Box plot - the dotted line shows the median. Half the data lies below this point, ie, half of the girls are below 65.5cm and half of the boys are below 69cm.







Last term as part of their assessment task, Stage 5 used different materials and toys to create ziplines. They then used trigonometry to determine the ideal height, length and angles for their toy zipline.








Riverina EEC - Art Gallery Exhibition
