Homework is handed out on **Thursdays** and collected on **Wednesdays** to be checked. Students can BYOD daily once technology agreement has been returned.

### **SCHOOL TIMES**

School starts at 8:55am. Please ensure your child arrives on time. Staff members are rostered on duty from 8:25am. Before that time, there is no formal supervision. Students arriving after the bell rings must go to the office to collect a late slip. 5/6 Cheng students work until 3:00pm so if you are using Kiss and Drop, please arrive **after** this time to collect your child. ## **SPORT**

This term, PSSA AFL and netball continues on **Fridays** from Week 2. Those staying at school will participate in sport activities, including modified games. Students are expected to wear full sport uniform on Fridays. They must also wear their school hat each day and bring a drink bottle.

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#### **LIBRARY**

Students will have weekly library lessons with Mrs McWilliams. They need to bring their library bag each **Wednesday** so that they can borrow books. Students are participating in the Premier's Reading Challenge again this year which ends in September.

#### **HOMEWORK**

Stage 3 homework is set every week and begins next week. Homework will include reading, writing, maths mentals and choice of an activity from the homework grid provided. Activities will be uploaded on **Mondays** and communicated through Google Classroom, which is accessible through your child's Department of Education student portal. Students should submit their homework, either online or through a hardcopy, on **Fridays**. Please inform me if your child is unable to complete homework for any reason. Homework activities should be monitored and checked by parents.

#### **OVERVIEW OF KEY LEARNING AREAS**

#### **ENGLISH**

In Term 3, students will continue working with <u>Rabbit, Soldier, Angel, Thief</u> by Katrina Nannestad to explore the textual concepts of imagery, symbol and connotation, supported by The Feather by Margaret Wild. They will also study the mentor text <u>Worse Things</u> to gain a deeper understanding of perspective, context and theme, analysing how authorial choices reflect personal, social and cultural influences. A comprehensive literacy program including spelling, vocabulary, guided reading and handwriting will also be explicitly taught.

Each term, students are assessed and their progress tracked against key comprehension skills. These markers show what students should achieve by the end of Term 3.

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## **MATHEMATICS**

This term our lessons will focus on the topics of volume, multiplicative relations, position, mass and area. Students should continue to practise key skills from Terms 1 and 2 concepts, including using positive and negative numbers and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.

Each term, students are assessed and their progress tracked against key numeracy skills. The markers below show what students should achieve by the end of Term 3.

#### SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

Students will investigate various contact and non-contact forces including gravity, air resistance, buoyancy, tension and elastic force.

Through practical investigations linked to space travel, they will explore how forces act as pushes or pulls, how gravity varies on different planets, and how energy can be transformed. They will apply the scientific method, build models like rockets and catapults, and develop critical thinking and scientific vocabulary.

#### **GEOGRAPHY**

Students will investigate how people, particularly Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, influence and are influenced by the natural environment in Australia and around the world. They will explore how climate and landforms shape human characteristics of places, and how human activity affects environmental characteristics. Students will also locate major countries in North America and Europe and examine their key features.

### PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Students will participate in PSSA (AFL or Netball) or other school sports activities. In PDH, students will learn what a drug is and explore how drugs can be both helpful and harmful. They will categorise drugs as legal or illegal and discuss the importance of using medicines safely. Students will analyse situations where harm may occur, and use decision-making skills to make informed and safe choices. All students in K-6 will participate in weekly Peer Support sessions on Monday afternoons. They will be in mixed grade groups, with activities led by Stage 3 students. Lessons will focus on positive relationships and incorporate The Resilience Project.

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## **CREATIVE ARTS**

Mrs Lawrence will continue to take the class for music lessons each week. Drama activities will be incorporated into these lessons.
