This week's Learning Intention revisits one from last year and in preparation for Term 3, we are working on having a **"POSITIVE**"



MINDSET". Below are some examples you can use with your children:

• Recording Awe Moments:

Encourage your child to create an Awe Journal. They can record sights or moments from their daily lives that they find beautiful or extraordinary: a rainbow, a kind act, or even the smell of freshly baked cookies.

Sharing Positivity

Share positive experiences with your child; laugh, hug, set aside time to provide your undivided attention, and enjoy positive experiences together.

• Practice Positive Affirmations:

Every child experiences negative self-talk but you can prevent it from becoming hard-wired thinking by encouraging short, positive, present-tense affirmations; I am kind, I am a good friend, I am unique. Encourage your child to make up their own.


