Below are some ideas for literacy and numeracy activities at home.

Literacy and Numeracy Week Activities for home

Primary literacy

Scavenger hunt sounds

Choose a sound or letter (for example, 's'). Search around the house for things that begin with that sound. Say the word, write it down, or draw it.

Who Am I? game

Think of an animal or character. Give 3 clues and have someone guess. Swap roles. Optional: write clues down first.

Sticky note story

Write one sentence on each sticky note to build a story. Move them around to change the sequence.

Letter to a toy

Write a short letter to a favourite toy or stuffed animal. Ask questions or describe your day.

Read and ac

Choose a book. After reading a page or two, act out part of the story with props.

Syllable clap

Clap out the syllables of everyday items (for example, toothbrush = 2). Make a list of items with 1, 2, or 3+ syllables.

Name 5

Choose a category (for example, animals, food). Name 5 items and use them in a silly sentence.

Weather reporter

Look outside and write or say a weather report as if you were on the news. Add fun details (for example, toothbrush, "It's raining cats and dogs!").

Build-a-word

Use paper, pebbles, or magnetic letters to make simple words. Change one letter at a time (cat \rightarrow hat \rightarrow hot \rightarrow hop).

Primary numeracy

Select the links or scan the QR code to learn more about these primary numeracy activities.

Creating schedules

<u>Creating schedules</u> are a fun way to learn about time and being organised.



Guess the colour

Play guess the colour to explore ideas of probability.



Handfuls

<u>Handfuls</u> create collections of objects to get your child estimating numbers.



Nature walk

Take a <u>nature walk</u> collecting different items that can be arranged in length.



Pig (dice game)

Improve your child's confidence with addition while playing pig.



Rubik's cube

Explore the algebraic formula to solve a Rubik's cube.



Scavenger hunt

Go on a scavenger hunt to learn the basics of positioning.



Sketching a portrait

Use shapes while <u>sketching a portrait</u> from plants to family members.



Snakes and ladders

<u>Snakes and ladders</u> is a great board game to build mathematically skills and understanding.



Story book spotting

Story book spotting builds language to identify and describe illustrations when reading.






