#### **State Drama Ensemble Success**





## Yowr High Potential and Hifted child and what the Research says.....

High Potential and Gifted children are broadly considered to fall within one or more 'domains'. Each newsletter this term, we will focus on describing one domain so you can consider how each of these relates to your child. The last newsletter focused on the Creative Domain, and today we will look at the Social-Emotional Domain.

#### The Creative Domain

The Social-Emotional Domain refers to natural abilities in self-management and relating to and interacting with others. Students who excel in the social-emotional domain may demonstrate one or more of the following characteristics, at a notably higher level than their peers:

- Perceptiveness
- · Empathy
- Social Ease
- Tactfulness
- Influence
- Persuasiveness
- · Eloquence
- Leadership
- · Charisma

#### How are these students supported at school?

Students are often supported to achieve in class through differentiation across all faculties. Oxley High School also offers a range of additional opportunities, such as Creating Chances, Junior Rangers and the Student Representative Council.
