Kindergarten

- All children must be in compulsory schooling by their sixth birthday.
- Children can start Kindergarten at the beginning of the school year if they turn 5 on or before 31 July of that year.
- Students should start school at the beginning of the school year.
- Students identified as gifted, who turn 5 years after 31 July of the year of enrolment, may be enrolled per the <u>High Potential and Gifted Education Policy</u>
- NSW Government schools have specific local enrolment areas, use <u>School Finder</u> to find your local NSW Government school.



Enrolment of Local Students

Complete <u>Online enrolment for NSW Government schools</u> or <u>Application to enrol in a NSW Government school form (PDF 930 KB)</u> (downloadable), and <u>translated forms.</u>

Also supplying:

- Child's birth certificate or identity documents
- Child's <u>proof of address</u> such as current council rates notice, residential lease, electricity bill.
 Schools that are above or near their local enrolment buffer will use the Department's 100-point residential address check.
- Immunisation history statement from the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR)
- Any family law or other relevant court orders, if applicable
- If your child has health, disability or other support needs, you will need to provide copies of medical/healthcare or emergency action plan and evidence of any disability and learning and support plans

Enrolment of Non-Local Enrolment

Parents/Carers must submit a non-local enrolment application. These can be submitted manually through the <u>Application to enrol in a non-local NSW Government school form (PDF 286 KB)</u> or digitally through the <u>Online Enrolment for NSW Government schools</u> application form.

Non-Local Enrolment Criteria

Equity and excellence are key to public education. Parents/Carers may enrol their child at any government school, if the child is eligible to attend and the school can accommodate the child. The following criteria, applied equitably to all applicants, are documented and made available to parents/carers interested in enrolling their children. Criteria will be strictly applied and reviewed by the Placement Panel, to determine whether a place will be offered. Parents/Carers provide details of their circumstances within Section 3 of the application:

- Siblings currently attending the school
- Parent or carer works at the school
- Proximity and access to the school
- Safety and supervision of the student before and after school
- Structure and organisation of the school (for example sporting and or music programs)
- School is under buffer or cap and has capacity
- Other considerations including compassionate grounds

Placement Panel

Panania Public School has established a Placement Panel to consider and make recommendations on all non-local enrolment applications, based on Department of Education criteria. The panel is composed of two Assistant Principals and School Administration Manager.

Appeals

Where a Parent/Carer wishes to appeal against the decision of the Placement Panel, the appeal should be made in-writing to the Principal who will seek to resolve the matter at the local level. Further appeal rights are directed to the Director of Educational Leadership, who will make a determination. The determination will be based on whether, or not the stated criteria have been applied fairly.

AED INSTALLATION

New AED Installed at Panania Public School On Picnic Point Road – Thanks To Greg Page And Heart Of The Nation

We are pleased to inform our school community that a new Automated External Defibrillator (AED) was installed last week on the school fence near the corner gate on Picnic Point Road. This life-saving device was generously donated by Greg Page, the original Yellow Wiggle from the beloved children's group, *The Wiggles*.

Following his own sudden cardiac arrest in January 2020, Greg founded the charity *Heart of the Nation*, which aims to improve access to defibrillators across Australia. We are incredibly grateful for this donation, which enhances the safety of our school and wider community. Thank you, Greg, for your ongoing commitment to saving lives.

The AED has tracking technology fitted to the device which sends notifications when the AED is moved. The tracking device alerts the National Heart Foundation which, in turn, alerts Emergency Services so an ambulance can attend. The tracking device also helps to prevent theft, and to recover the AED if it has been moved. Please note, that when the AED box is opened an alarm is emitted and tracking commences.

The AED will be monitored by WHS staff members on a regular basis to make sure it is clean and in good working order. Thank you to Mr Wilson for kindly installing the AED cabinet on the fence for us.





About the program

Owl Kids is a group program supporting children who have or are experiencing parental separation. The program was created to provide children with a safe space to develop their emotional literacy through creative therapy, as well as the opportunity to interact with other children in similar situations.

For many children, their parents' separation can change how they view or make sense of the world, their relationships, and safety.

Who is Owl Kids for?

The program is suitable for children that:

- are aged 7 12 years old
 are adjusting to some of the difficulties of parental separation
- have already or about to be told about their parents' separation
- have been impacted by parental conflict.

Children will have the opportunity to:

- explore concepts of family, identity, and differences of families
- process their feelings and experiences, whilst building a better understanding around family circumstances
- process their own separation story, while being reassured that family separation is never a child's fault
- explore grief and loss experienced in response to parental separation
- identify safe coping strategies for self-care
- process the experience of living in two houses
 identify the differences between child
- and adult responsibilities and acknowledging the rights of being a child
- celebrate their learnings and progress throughout the program.

When and how does it run?

The program runs during school holidays with upcoming sessions published on catholiccare.org/owlkids.

Parent information session runs at the same time of the first group session. The session helps parents to understanding what Owl Kids is about, what the children might be bringing home, and how each parent can support them. An alternate session offers the other parent the opportunity to attend at a different time during the same week.

The final session is a presentation for the parents to attend, showcasing the children's progress and work through the program.
