The Unit will meet growing need in the community to cater for students with special needs.

WALKATHON


Flight 1809 bound for Panania Public School is boarding now! Have your passports ready, and bags ready for inspection.

If you get the chance, **pop into the library** to view the amazing student artwork on display.






