Executive Director Public Schools School Visit

Last Friday Cathy Brennan, Executive Director Public Schools for the Metropolitan North Directorate briefly visited Pymble Public School. During her visit, Mrs Brennan visited one of our year 2 classes, 2K to observe a writing lesson which was being taught by their teacher, Mrs Kingston-Smith. The children in 2K have been reading the children's book 'Sophie Scott Goes South' by Alison Lester, an informative text and learning about Antarctica in class.

As part of the new English curriculum, year 2 students are being explicitly taught how to write complex and compound sentences which include an independent and dependent clause, subordinate conjunctions and high-level vocabulary. The level of teaching and learning by the students is extraordinary. The children were clearly set up to succeed and confident in their engagement with the lesson. Mrs Brennan was impressed with Mrs Kingston-Smith's teaching and rapport with the students as well as the children's enthusiasm and engagement in the lesson. She commented that it was highly evident that explicit, engaging and rigorous learning and teaching is occurring at PPS.

I'd like to thank Mrs Kingston-Smith for allowing the executive director to visit her classroom. I'd also like to thank Mrs Brennan for taking time out of her busy schedule to visit our school.



New 2025 –2028 School Excellence Plan Parent Information Session, Thursday 27 March at 9am

The school leadership team together with our teaching staff over the past six months have prepared our new 2025 – 2028 School Plan (SEP). Our new SEP continues the school's emphasis on high level school improvement, excellence, student wellbeing, student growth and attainment, community partnerships and evidenced based teaching practices.

The school is holding a SEP Parent Information Session next Thursday 27 March in the school hall from 9-9.45am. During this session our school's planning processes, background data analysis and strategic directions and major initiatives as part of our new SEP will be presented. Parents and carers will also have the opportunity to ask clarifying questions.

We would like to see as many parents and carers as possible attend this parent information session.

2025 NAPLAN Testing

Over the past two weeks our years 3 and 5 students have undergone the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) online testing. The NAPLAN assessments are across the four domains of writing, reading, conventions of language and numeracy.

Our Year 5 students' last test was yesterday with year 3 students finishing their NAPLAN testing this Friday. NAPLAN is a point in time assessment and provides valuable diagnostic information on individual and groups of students. Together with school-based assessment data and other external data sets, NAPLAN helps to inform student achievement and importantly future teaching and learning plans.

KISS AND RIDE ZONES

Understanding the rules

**Kiss and Ride Zones are for your child's safety and for your convenience.
Designed for quick entry and exit, it minimises congestion
and risk when used properly.**

RULES

- Kiss and Ride zones and 'No Parking' zones operate under the same conditions.
- Drivers may stop in this zone to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of two minutes.
- The driver **MUST** remain in or within three metres of the vehicle at all times.
- The vehicle must not be left unattended.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.
- Penalties apply for illegally parking in School Zones. Rangers are active in the area.



REMEMBER

1. **DRIVERS DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE** - To assist with traffic flow in the Kiss and Ride Zone, drivers are encouraged to remain in the car while the children get in and out. To facilitate this, children should travel with bags in the car and not in the boot.
2. **BE TIMELY** - If your child does not enter or exit the vehicle within 2 minutes you are required to travel around the block and re-enter the zone at the end of the queue.

3. **KERB SIDE ENTRY / EXIT** - Ensure your child enters / exits the vehicle on the kerb side. Ensure your child has their restraint securely fastened before moving off from the Kiss and Ride Zone.
4. **STAY IN SEQUENCE** - Please queue in an orderly manner. Drop/pick-up your child as close as you can to the top of the zone, allowing vehicles following you to enter the designated area.
Do not cut in the queue
5. **NO U TURNS** - Do not make u-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk. Fines and demerit points apply.

School Supervision

School supervision commences at 8.30am each day when there are teachers on duty in the playground. Students should not be at school before this time unless they are enrolled in POOSH or are at supervised swimming, band or music lessons. If you need to leave for work before 8:30am please book your child into POOSH.

School finishes at 2:55pm and you need to collect your child/ren then or have them booked into POOSH. Students cannot stay in the playground and play unsupervised after 2.55pm.

If your child is attending after school activities such as Mandarin lessons and music tuition that begins after 3pm you will need to organise supervision for your child until these activities begin.

Late Arrivals

School begins at 8.55am. We still have many students who are regularly late to school in the morning. Some of these students are arriving late without a parent accompanying them to the office to explain why they are late. If students are late, they are missing valuable learning time. This may mean that family routines have to change, and children need to be in bed earlier each night in order to wake up earlier in the morning. Frequent unexplained late arrivals at school are recorded on School Bytes.

Absences from School

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, please either call or email the school office (pymble-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au) detailing your **child's full name, class and reason for their absence**.

Application for Extended Leave (Travel) Forms

As part of the NSW Department of Education's attendance policy, parents and carers are required to apply for extended leave if their child is going to be absent from school for a period of 5 consecutive days or more. This does not apply for periods of leave due to illness. This applies to planned periods of leave which exceed 5 or more days. Parents and carers can apply for Extended Leave online via the School Bytes Parent Portal under the 'Forms' menu option.

Annual School Contributions

Annual school contributions have now been finalised and added to your child's School Bytes account. These contributions are charged in Term 1 each year and remain a voluntary payment. As outlined in Mr Diodati's email earlier this week, children will not be disadvantaged by a family's inability to pay school contributions. If you require financial assistance with paying school contributions or the cost of a school activity or program, please contact the school to speak with Mr Diodati or one of our relieving Administration Managers (Mrs Weir or Mrs Frankish).

Student Details on School Bytes

Thank you to those children and parents who are returning library books before school on the day the children have their library lesson. With library lessons being so short it allows the children's borrowing to occur with fewer issues.

I would like to remind all parents that the day children have a lesson in the library is not the only time they are able to borrow. They may borrow each school day, either before school each day or at lunch (Tuesday to Thursday), if they have their library bag. It is good for the children not to fill their school bags too full, so spreading borrowing over more days in the week will allow the children to carry a lighter load each day. It also helps them to be more independent and responsible while also exposing them to a wider variety of books.

Families who have been here for several years will be aware that the school has a subscription to **World Book Online**. This subscription is current, and the username and password that you received last year is still valid. A copy of the flyer with the log in details will go out to each family this week. Please be aware that the log in details are NOT to be shared online or with non PPS families. It provides access to not only encyclopaedia articles at a number of ability levels, but also eBooks and other resources your family may find interesting, fun, and useful. One of the interesting and less well-known features, found in the settings, is the ability to translate the encyclopaedia articles into a wide range of languages, and to have the article read aloud in a variety of voices.

Each year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is sat by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2025 will take place from **Wednesday 12 March to Monday 24 March**.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school's learning assessment program. The tests assess literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school, so the best preparation is their everyday classroom learning. Our school will also undertake activities to help students become familiar with the types of questions and tools available in the online tests.

School Travel Passes

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to [apply](#) or [update](#) their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their [local bus operator](#) to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note:** some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the [Opal terms of use](#).

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the [Student code of conduct](#). The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.

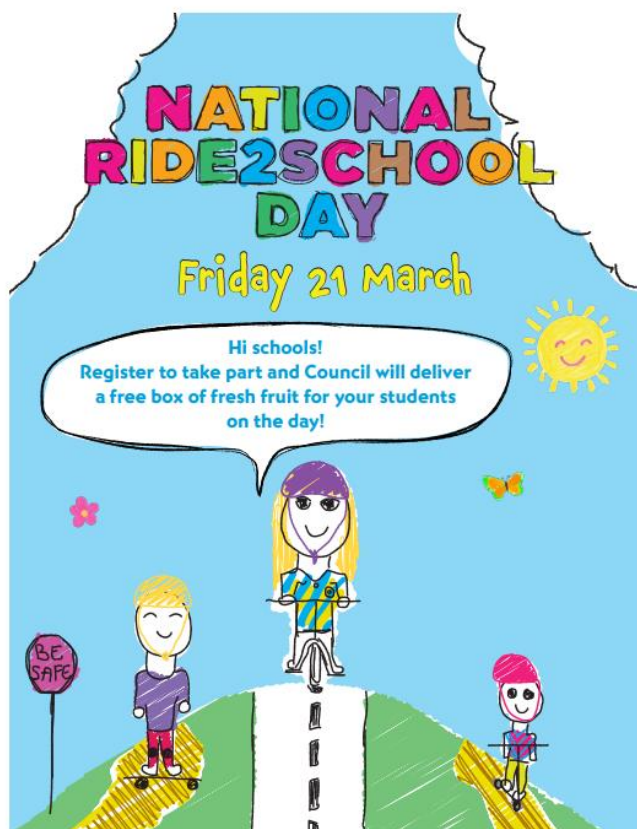

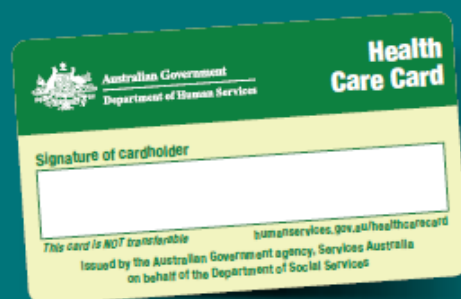
