Road Safety

As we continue to prioritise the safety of our students, we would like to remind everyone of some important road safety practices when dropping off and picking up your children.

Safe Vehicle Entry and Exit

To ensure the safety of all students, please remind your children to enter and exit vehicles from the rear passenger door only. This practice minimises the risk of accidents occurring as they get in and out of the car. Additionally, we ask that school bags are stored inside the vehicle, rather than in the boot, to prevent any unnecessary delays during drop-off and pick-up times and maintain student safety.

Kiss 'n' Ride Rules

Our 'Kiss 'n' Ride' area is designed to keep traffic flowing smoothly while ensuring the safety of our students. Please adhere to the following rules:

- Pull up as far forward as possible in the designated area.
- Stay in your vehicle while your child enters or exits.
- Do not leave your vehicle unattended in the Kiss 'n' Ride zone.
- Standing in this area is only permitted for up to 2 minutes and the driver is only permitted to leave the vehicle for up to 3 metres.

Parking Considerations

To maintain safety and accessibility for all, please refrain from parking across residential driveways or double parking while in the carline. These actions can obstruct traffic flow and pose a risk to pedestrians and other vehicles.

We appreciate your cooperation in making our school a safe environment for everyone. Let's work together to keep our children safe!

BE IN LINE BY 5 TO 9

Our school day begins promptly at 8:55am, not 9:00am Hence the messaging we would like to start using with students and parents/carers is:

"Be in line by 5 to 9"

It is essential that all students are in their classrooms by this time, ready to engage in their learning activities. Arriving on time ensures that your child does not miss out on important instructions and sets the tone for a productive day.

Plan Ahead: Allow Extra Time

We understand that mornings can be busy, and the "Carline/ Kiss and Drop" area often experiences long lines particularly in wet weather. To help alleviate this, we encourage parents to plan ahead and allow extra time for drop-off. Arriving a few minutes earlier can make a significant difference in ensuring your child is on time.

Late Arrivals and Absentee Marking

Students who are not in class by 8:55am will be marked as absent. These students are required to obtain a late note from the school office before heading to their classroom. This procedure helps us maintain accurate attendance records and ensures that all students are accounted for. When there are a large number of students who are late, lining up to get a late note also adds to the time to get to class.

Parental Responsibilities for Late Arrivals

If your child arrives late, we kindly ask that you accompany them to the school office to provide an explanation, not just drop them out the front of the school.

Administration News

Absences from School

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, please either call or email the school office (<u>pymble-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>) detailing your *child's full name*, *class and reason for their absence*.

Application for Extended Leave (Travel) Forms

As part of the NSW Department of Education's attendance policy, parents and carers are required to apply for extended leave if their child is going to be absent from school for a period of 5 consecutive days or more. This does not apply for periods of leave due to illness. This applies to planned periods of leave which exceed 5 or more days. Parents and carers can apply for Extended Leave online via the School Bytes Parent Portal under the 'Forms' menu option.

Annual School Contributions

Annual school contributions have now been finalised and added to your child's School Bytes account. These contributions are charged in Term 1 each year and remain a voluntary payment. As outlined in Mr Diodati's email earlier this week, children will not be disadvantaged by a family's inability to pay school contributions. If you require financial assistance with paying school contributions or the cost of a school activity or program, please contact the school to speak with Mr Diodati or one of our relieving Administration Managers (Mrs Weir or Mrs Frankish).

BERRY ST UPDATE

This term, we are concentrating on creating our own individual Ready to Learn Plans which are useful not only in the classroom but also in the playground and in general life. The first thing that we ask students to identify is "What is your body telling You." We ask them to say how they are feeling and where in their body they feel stress.

Teachers have discussed the following questions with their class.

- 1. Where do you feel stress in your body?
- 2. What signs does your body give you?
- 3. What situations cause you to feel stress?

Students are asked to draw an outline of their body and to identify where they feel stress.

Please have a conversation with your child regarding their response to these questions.

KISS AND RIDE ZONES

Understanding the rules

Kiss and Ride Zones are for your child's safety and for your convenience.

Designed for quick entry and exit, it minimises congestion
and risk when used properly.

RULES

- Kiss and Ride zones and 'No Parking' zones operate under the same conditions.
- Drivers may stop in this zone to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of two minutes.
- The driver MUST remain in or within three metres of the vehicle at all times.
- · The vehicle must not be left unattended.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.
- Penalties apply for illegally parking in School Zones.
 Rangers are active in the area.



REMEMBER

- DRIVERS DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE To assist with traffic flow in the Kiss and Ride Zone, drivers are encouraged to remain in the car while the children get in and out. To facilitate this, children should travel with bags in the car and not in the boot.
- BE TIMELY If your child does not enter or exit the vehicle within 2 minutes you are required to travel around the block and re-enter the zone at the end of the queue. (Insert Street names relevant to your school)
- KERB SIDE ENTRY / EXIT Ensure your child enters / exits the vehicle on the kerb side. Ensure your child has their restraint securely fastened before moving off from the Kiss and Ride Zone.
- 4. STAY IN SEQUENCE Please queue in an orderly manner. Drop/pick-up your child as close as you can to the top of the zone, allowing vehicles following you to enter the designated area.
 Do not cut in the queue
- NO U TURNS Do not make u-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk, Fines and demerit points apply.

Kiss and Ride Zones need cooperation to ensure the safety of all children.

School Student Travel



School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.
