Online Guardians

Recently the school enlisted the 'Online Guardians' to speak with our students from years 3 to 6 and parents about cyber-safety and social media. The Online Guardians are focused on providing the most recent and relevant education to audiences. They ensure that their content leads to positive change by remaining on top of trends, cultures and usage within schools. They actively collect and collate data regularly to ensure that we are moving with the times and providing the best possible education and direction to children and parents.

Our presenter conducted a pre-student survey which collected information about children's Internet, gaming and social media usage and online behaviours. This data was shared with students and parents as part of the presentations. Rob Tucker has run these sessions at PPS for over 3 years and has noted that there is a definitive increase in students at PPS demonstrating safer online behaviours. Together with parental support, the school will continue to provide support for students around cyber-safety and the responsible use of social media.

Late arrivals

BE IN LINE BY 5 TO 9

Our school day begins promptly at 8:55am, not 9:00am Hence the messaging we would like to start using with students and parents/carers is:

"Be in line by 5 to 9"

It is essential that all students are in their classrooms by this time, ready to engage in their learning activities. Arriving on time ensures that your child does not miss out on important instructions and sets the tone for a productive day.

Plan Ahead: Allow Extra Time

We understand that mornings can be busy, and the "Carline/ Kiss and Drop" area often experiences long lines particularly in wet weather. To help alleviate this, we encourage parents to plan ahead and allow extra time for drop-off. Arriving a few minutes earlier can make a significant difference in ensuring your child is on time.

Late Arrivals and Absentee Marking

Students who are not in class by 8:55am will be marked as absent. These students are required to obtain a late note accompanied by a parent from the school office before heading to their classroom. This procedure helps us maintain accurate attendance records and ensures that all students are accounted for. When there are a large number of students who are late, lining up to get a late note also adds to the time to get to class.

2025 NSW Public School's Student Survey

In two weeks, our school will be participating in the NSW Public School Student Survey. This confidential online survey gives students the opportunity to share their thoughts and feelings about life at school, including their engagement, learning experiences, and wellbeing. The survey takes about 10 to 15 minutes to complete and will be conducted during school hours.

Hearing directly from our students helps us understand what's working well and where we can improve. Participation is voluntary. **If you do not wish for your child to take part, please complete the online opt-out consent form**, which was emailed to all parents last week. Please only complete the 'opt-out consent' form if you DO NOT wish your child to take part in this student survey.

Advice for Families

COVID-smart school settings reflect NSW Health's latest COVID-19 guidelines and the department's management of COVID-19 within educational settings.COVID-19 is still active in the community. While COVID-19 remains an unpredictable virus, NSW Health advise it will continue to present a health risk to the community.

Schools continue to implement baseline COVID-smart measures to help reduce the risk of transmission for students and staff members. These key COVID-smart measures include:

- staying home until you are well
- following NSW Health <u>Advice for people exposed to COVID-19</u>
- strongly encouraging staff, students and families stay up to date with vaccinations (including COVID-19 boosters, when eligible)
- practicing good hygiene including regular hand washing
- maintaining natural ventilation
- recommending staff and visitors wear a mask when working with students at greater risk of serious illness should they contract COVID-19, regardless of school type, particularly indoors and when physical distancing is not possible
- assessing risk and applying appropriate safeguards across activities and events.

Students, staff and visitors should only attend school when feeling well and symptom-free. Follow NSW Health advice on Testing and what to do if you have COVID-19.

Parents and carers of children with persistent or ongoing <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u> should discuss these with their local health care professional. These symptoms may be related to other illnesses (such as allergies or hay fever) and benefit from treatment and management by a doctor.

From the start of 2024, rapid antigen tests (RAT) are no longer available free of charge to schools. NSW Health recommend testing for COVID-19 if you have symptoms and are at higher risk of serious illness. Please note that, parents and carers are still required to inform the school if their child tests positive to Covid-19.

KISS AND RIDE ZONES

Understanding the rules

Kiss and Ride Zones are for your child's safety and for your convenience.

Designed for quick entry and exit, it minimises congestion

and risk when used properly.

RULES

- Kiss and Ride zones and 'No Parking' zones operate under the same conditions.
- Drivers may stop in this zone to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of two minutes.
- The driver MUST remain in or within three metres of the vehicle at all times.
- · The vehicle must not be left unattended.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.
- Penalties apply for illegally parking in School Zones.
 Rangers are active in the area.



REMEMBER

- DRIVERS DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE To assist with traffic flow in the Kiss and Ride Zone, drivers are encouraged to remain in the car while the children get in and out. To facilitate this, children should travel with bags in the car and not in the boot.
- BE TIMELY If your child does not enter or exit the vehicle within 2 minutes you are required to travel around the block and re-enter the zone at the end of the queue. (Insert Street names relevant to your school)
- KERB SIDE ENTRY / EXIT Ensure your child enters / exits the vehicle on the kerb side. Ensure your child has their restraint securely fastened before moving off from the Kiss and Ride Zone.
- 4. STAY IN SEQUENCE Please queue in an orderly manner. Drop/pick-up your child as close as you can to the top of the zone, allowing vehicles following you to enter the designated area.
 Do not cut in the queue
- NO U TURNS Do not make u-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk. Fines and demerit points apply.

Kiss and Ride Zones need cooperation to ensure the safety of all children.

Deputy Principal's News

We have several students at PPS who have allergies or anaphylaxis. We carefully manage the safety and wellbeing of these students at school in line with the Department's 'Anaphylaxis and Allergy Procedures for Schools'. We strongly encourage all parents and carers to support the school by not sending food to school that has been identified as peanuts, tree nuts or any nut products with their children to school. We also ask that if a student in your child's class has a known anaphylaxis allergy to another food that parents and carers support the school by not sending that food to school. The support of the whole school community in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Photographs of Students

We are reminding parents that videoing and taking of photos of other students is not permitted. When taking photos on school grounds of your child during school events, other students may be inadvertently in the photo or video and permission has not be obtained by their parents or carers to take this. With many sporting events planned for this term, we ask that parents and carers please check any photos or videos that they plan to post online or on social media accounts do not contain other students as parents and carers have not given permission for this.

Administration News

Absences from School

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, please either call or email the school office (<u>pymble-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>) detailing your <u>child's full name, class and reason for their absence</u>.

Application for Extended Leave (Travel) Forms

As part of the NSW Department of Education's attendance policy, parents and carers are required to apply for extended leave if their child is going to be absent from school for a period of 5 consecutive days or more. This does not apply for periods of leave due to illness. This applies to planned periods of leave which exceed 5 or more days. Parents and carers can apply for Extended Leave online via the School Bytes Parent Portal under the 'Forms' menu option.

Annual School Contributions

Annual school contributions have now been finalised and added to your child's School Bytes account. These contributions are charged in Term 1 each year and remain a voluntary payment. As outlined in Mr Diodati's email earlier this week, children will not be disadvantaged by a family's inability to pay school contributions. If you require financial assistance with paying school contributions or the cost of a school activity or program, please contact the school to speak with Mr Diodati or one of our relieving Administration Managers (Mrs Weir or Mrs Frankish).

Berry Street Educational Model



READY TO LEARN PLANS (CONTINUED)

The second phased of a Ready to Learn Plan is for the student to identify strategies that they can use to de-escalate and become ready to learn. These can include strategies such as:

- Go to a quiet space
- Ask to talk to an adult (identify 5 trusted adults that you can confidently approach when help is needed)
- Stretch my body
- Focus on deep breathing
- Count backwards from 10 or 100

- Use a fidget toy
- Sing your favourite song in your head while concentrating on breathing
- Organise your workspace so that when you are Ready to Learn it is ready to go
- Begin with A and list Countries/ Names that begin with each letter (do this in your head)



Have a conversation with your child about the strategies that they have included on their Ready To Learn Plan and help them to refine these if necessary.

School Travel Passes

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.







