


### Stage One Gibberagong Environmental Education Centre Excursion

### AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT - Children's Online Privacy Code

The Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC), the Australian Government's privacy regulator, is seeking input from parents and carers to assist them in its development of the Children's Online Privacy Code (the Code). The Code will put children at the centre of privacy protections in Australia. By the time a child turns 13, it's estimated that 72 million pieces of data will have been collected about them. The aim of the Code is to strengthen privacy protections for the handling of children's personal information. Your insights as a parent or carer are important. ### Advice for Families

COVID-smart school settings reflect NSW Health's latest COVID-19 guidelines and the department's management of COVID-19 within educational settings. COVID-19 is still active in the community. While COVID-19 remains an unpredictable virus, NSW Health advise it will continue to present a health risk to the community.

Schools continue to implement baseline COVID-smart measures to help reduce the risk of transmission for students and staff members. These key COVID-smart measures include:

- staying home until you are well
- following NSW Health <u>Advice for people exposed to COVID-19</u>
- strongly encouraging staff, students and families stay up to date with vaccinations (including COVID-19 boosters, when eligible)
- practicing good hygiene including regular hand washing
- maintaining natural ventilation
- recommending staff and visitors wear a mask when working with students at greater risk of serious illness should they contract COVID-19, regardless of school type, particularly indoors and when physical distancing is not possible
- assessing risk and applying appropriate safeguards across activities and events.

Students, staff and visitors should only attend school when feeling well and symptom-free. Follow NSW Health advice on <u>Testing and what to do if you have COVID-19</u>

Parents and carers of children with persistent or ongoing <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u> should discuss these with their local health care professional. These symptoms may be related to other illnesses (such as allergies or hay fever) and benefit from treatment and management by a doctor.

From the start of 2024, rapid antigen tests (RAT) are no longer available free of charge to schools. NSW Health recommend testing for COVID-19 if you have symptoms and are at higher risk of serious illness. Please note that, parents and carers are still required to inform the school if their child tests positive to Covid-19.

### Road Safety

As we continue to prioritise the safety of our students, we would like to remind everyone of some important road safety practices when dropping off and picking up your children.

### Safe Vehicle Entry and Exit

To ensure the safety of all students, please remind your children to enter and exit vehicles from the rear passenger door only. This practice minimises the risk of accidents occurring as they get in and out of the car. Additionally, we ask that school bags are stored inside the vehicle, rather than in the boot, to prevent any unnecessary delays during drop-off and pick-up times and maintain student safety.

### Kiss 'n' Ride Rules

Our 'Kiss 'n' Ride' area is designed to keep traffic flowing smoothly while ensuring the safety of our students. Please adhere to the following rules:

- · Pull up as far forward as possible in the designated area.
- · Stay in your vehicle while your child enters or exits.
- · Do not leave your vehicle unattended in the Kiss 'n' Ride zone.
- · Standing in this area is only permitted for up to 2 minutes and the driver is only permitted to leave the vehicle for up to 3 metres.

#### Parking Considerations

To maintain safety and accessibility for all, please refrain from parking across residential driveways or double parking while in the carline. These actions can obstruct traffic flow and pose a risk to pedestrians and other vehicles.

### KISS AND RIDE ZONES

### Understanding the rules

Kiss and Ride Zones are for your child's safety and for your convenience. Designed for quick entry and exit, it minimises congestion and risk when used properly.

#### **RULES**

- Kiss and Ride zones and 'No Parking' zones operate under the same conditions
- Drivers may stop in this zone to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of two minutes.
- The driver MUST remain in or within three metres of the
- The vehicle must not be left unattended.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.
- Penalties apply for illegally parking in School Zones.
   Rangers are active in the area.



#### REMEMBER

- DRIVERS DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE To assist with traffic flow in the Kiss and Ride Zone, drivers are encouraged to remain in the car while the children get in and out. To facilitate this, children should travel with bags in the car and not in the boot.
- 2. BE TIMELY If your child does not enter or exit the vehicle within 2 minutes you are required to travel around the block and re-enter the zone at the end of the queue. (Insert Street names relevant to your school)
- KERB SIDE ENTRY / EXIT Ensure your child enters / exits the vehicle on the kerb side. Ensure your child has their restraint securely fastened before moving off from the Kiss and Ride Zone.
- 4. STAY IN SEQUENCE Please queue in an orderly manner. Drop/pick-up your child as close as you can to the top of the zone, allowing vehicles following you to enter the designated area.

- NO U TURNS Do not make u-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk. Fines and demerit points apply.



### Be in line by 5 to 9

**Thank you** to all those parents who have made a positive impact by arriving on time. There has been a large reduction in students who are arriving late over the last few weeks which has been wonderful to see.

Arriving at school on time is essential for setting a positive tone for the day. It allows students to settle into their classrooms, engage with their teachers, and connect with their peers before lessons begin.

We understand that mornings can be hectic, with busy schedules and various responsibilities. However, your efforts to ensure your child arrives at school on time do not go unnoticed. Whether it's setting an earlier alarm, preparing lunches the night before, or encouraging your child to be ready on time, every little bit helps!

### Catching the school bus

Many of our students rely on public transport to get home after school, and the Opal card is essential for this travel. The bus drivers in the afternoon have many students wanting to catch the bus but do not have an OPAL card with them. They need to tap on and off every time they catch the bus.

### Introducing the School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using the train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

### Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

#### Years K-2 (Infants)


There's no minimum distance.

#### Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

### Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.



### Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at apps.transport.nsw.aov.au/ssts

### How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

#### Step 1


Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at transportnsw.info/school-students

### Step 2

The school endorses your application.

#### Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.






### **Better together**

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays.

### Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- · Concession fares across the Opal network
- Half-price travel after eight paid journeys each week\*
- \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off †
- The Opal Transfer Discount doesn't apply when transferring between light rail and Sydney Ferries.
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel.

#### **Administration News**

### Absences from School (whole day or part day)

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, please either call or email the school office (<u>pymble-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>) detailing your <u>child's full name, class and reason for their absence</u>.

If your child is late to school for any reason (ie: arriving after 8.55am), please accompany your child to the school office to sign them in. Students who arrive late to school without a parent will be marked 'Late – Unexplained' and parents will be required to provide an explanation via the School Bytes Parent Portal.

### Administration of Pain Relief Medication

Please be aware that the school cannot administer pain relief in the form of paracetamol or ibuprofen to students unless this medication has been provided to the school <u>and</u> we have written authority from parents to do so. Should students require pain relief for an injury or illness that has occurred at school, parents will be contacted to collect their child and/or administer medication themselves.

If your child requires pain relief for a recent injury or ailment and you would like school staff to administer this medication at school for a short period of time, please complete the Request for Administering Medication form (found on the School Bytes Parent Portal under the 'Resources' tab) and bring the medication to the office.

Please note that students are not permitted to carry medication on themselves or in their school bag at any time.

### A Reminder About Manners in our School Community

We have noticed recently that some students are not using their manners when speaking with office staff. Please remind your children of the importance of respectful communication, as it fosters a positive school environment. Thank you for your support in reinforcing good manners at home!

### Application for Extended Leave (Travel) Forms

As part of the NSW Department of Education's attendance policy, parents and carers are required to apply for extended leave if their child is going to be absent from school for a period of 5 consecutive days or more. This does not apply for

periods of leave due to illness. This applies to planned periods of leave which exceed 5 or more days. Parents and carers can apply for Extended Leave online via the School Bytes Parent Portal under the 'Forms' menu option.

### WHAT are Brain Breaks?

SHORT- less than 4 minutesinterruption to our study time that supports renewed focus and attention. Brain Breaks help to build self-awareness and develop self-regulation for learning.

WHY are Brain Breaks Important for Learning?

No matter how young or old you are, we all need to take a break from focussed attention

At school we use Brain Breaks in each session of learning to refocus students on the task at hand. Sometimes the Brain Breaks involve physical activity and sometimes they are more passive. Ask you child what their favourite Brain Break is. In the following weeks I will be sharing some of our favourites. These can be used to focus your child on tasks at home as well as at school.

### School student travel information for parents and students

### **School Travel Passes**

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

#### Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.







