

#### Mungo Camp

Last week, I attended the 5-day 2025 Year 6 student leaders camp to the Gol Gol and Mungo National Park. I was accompanied by Miss Fryer and Miss Gillis. This camp provided an opportunity for student leaders to develop a deeper understanding of the significance of Mungo as well as indigenous culture. This experience aims to deepen student and staff knowledge of Mungo along with Aboriginal history, culture, and achievements.

After flying to Mildura, we spent our first day at the Gol Gol Cultural Immersion Centre set on the Murray River, participating in art and archaeological dig activities along with learning about aboriginal history and culture.





We then spent a full day out in Mungo National Park with local Barkandji elder Uncle Warren.







The following day we visited Orange World, the botanical gardens and Gol Gol Public School. Our leaders presented a fabulous presentation about PPS and then joined in lunchtime games and a music and sport lesson after lunch.



Our final day started with an environmental education presentation where the students learnt about protecting our native animals along with meeting some fantastic animals. We then visited Wentworth, where the Murray River meets the Darling River, with our trip concluding with a visit to the Perry Sand Hills.

Thank you to the teachers who attended the camp and to the students for their excellent behaviour and manners during a long week.

#### School student travel information for parents and students

#### **School Travel Passes**

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

#### Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.




