Exciting Update: New Bubbler Drinking and Bottle Refilling Stations!

We are thrilled to announce that during the recent school holidays, our school has installed four new water drinking and bottle refilling stations. These modern bubbler stations not only provide easy access to clean, fresh drinking water but also feature both drinking fountains and convenient bottle refilling spouts.

What makes these new units even more special is their beautiful indigenous artwork, which was thoughtfully selected by our Student Representative Council (SRC) after conducting a survey among students. The vibrant designs enhance our school environment while celebrating our cultural heritage.

Among the new installations, two bubbler units now dispense filtered water, one each located in the K-2 playground and the primary playground areas. The remaining four units will provide clean tap water. Each filtered water station will be labelled for easy identification.

A heartfelt thank you goes out to our school's P&C for their generous funding towards the supply and installation of these new bubbler units. They are a fantastic addition to our school grounds, ensuring that our students have ample opportunities to stay hydrated and refill their water bottles throughout the day.

Deputy Principal's News

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. Japanese Teachers Visiting PPS

On Wednesday we welcomed a group of four Japanese teachers to PPS. The tour was organised through the Department of Education Study Tours Program. This program provides opportunities for primary and secondary schools to welcome groups of overseas students or education professionals. The teachers visited some of our classrooms to see Kindergarten phonics and phonemic awareness, a Yr 2 writing lesson, Year 4 Science and a 5/6 choir lesson in the hall. The teachers then met with our school executive staff to learn more about the Australian Education system, while we were able to find out more about education in Japan. The visit concluded with an Australian morning tea. Thank you to the teachers and the students who made the tour group feel very welcome.













Administration News

Absences from School (whole day or part day)

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, please either call or email the school office (<u>pymble-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>) detailing your <u>child's full name, class and reason for their absence</u>.

If your child is late to school for any reason (ie: arriving after 8.55am), please accompany your child to the school office to sign them in. Students who arrive late to school without a parent will be marked 'Late – Unexplained' and parents will be required to provide an explanation via the School Bytes Parent Portal.

Administration of Pain Relief Medication

Please be aware that the school cannot administer pain relief in the form of paracetamol or ibuprofen to students unless this medication has been provided to the school <u>and</u> we have written authority from parents to do so. Should students require pain relief for an injury or illness that has occurred at school, parents will be contacted to collect their child and/or administer medication themselves.

If your child requires pain relief for a recent injury or ailment and you would like school staff to administer this medication at school for a short period of time, please complete the Request for Administering Medication form (found on the School Bytes Parent Portal under the 'Resources' tab) and bring the medication to the office.

Please note that students are not permitted to carry medication on themselves or in their school bag at any time.

A Reminder About Manners in our School Community

We have noticed recently that some students are not using their manners when speaking with office staff. Please remind your children of the importance of respectful communication, as it fosters a positive school environment. Thank you for your support in reinforcing good manners at home!



Application for Extended Leave (Travel) Forms

As part of the NSW Department of Education's attendance policy, parents and carers are required to apply for extended leave if their child is going to be absent from school for a period of 5 consecutive days or more. This does not apply for periods of leave due to illness. This applies to planned periods of leave which exceed 5 or more days. Parents and carers can apply for Extended Leave online via the School Bytes Parent Portal under the 'Forms' menu option.


Public Education Week 2025- Ignite your potential

BRAIN BREAKS



Students stand in a circle facing inwards. A nominated student begins by saying 'one'. The student to the left of the first one says 'two' and so on around the circle, calling out numbers in numerical order.


Seeking Grounds Committee Lead





School Travel Passes

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use .

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.
