Roxy - Support Dog





School Uniforms

The school uniform officially changes from the winter uniform to the summer uniform at the beginning of Term 4. As the seasons change, we encourage families to use their judgement when dressing students in school uniforms on days with particularly higher temperatures.

A positive and consistent uniform culture helps foster a sense of belonging, pride, and equality among our students. We kindly ask for your support in encouraging your child to wear only PPS uniform items to school. If you need assistance with uniforms, the second-hand uniform is a great source of quality second hand uniforms.

Lost Property and Musical instrument storage

The school's lost property and band instrument storage area below the hall stage area will now be closed from 9.30am to 2.30pm. If students need to check lost property for lost items, they will be able to check lost property outside these times. Parents and carers may also access this area to look for lost property before and after school.

If students are required to access their instruments during the school day between these hours, these instruments can be left safely in the music room. All other instruments need to be left in the band storage area prior to school and then collected after 2,30pm.

BERRY ST UPDATE TERM 3 WEEK 8 MOVEMENT AND RHYTHM FOR LEARNING

- Did you know that movement and rhythm are powerful tools to help regulate emotions?
- Different rhythms and tempos can either escalate us or de-escalate. They can also be used for coregulation if a group of people regulate to the same rhythm.
- We suggest that you find the style of music that your child can use to regulate themselves when they are dis-regulated
- The benefit of using music and rhythm is that your child can be encouraged to sing the rhythm in their head, allowing them to self-regulate.

Below are several activities that your child might like to try at home:

- 1. Make up a short dance. It must go for at least 20 seconds, It must include a clap and it must have at least one word.
- 2. Make your own musical instrument from things around the house. Tap out a rhythm, either one you make up yourself for one from song. Teach the rhythm to at least one other person.
- 3. Tap out the rhythm of your favourite song from memory and then play the song and see if you were correct.

It's that time of year again for our annual Jump Rope for Heart Fundraiser. Each year, the Heart Foundation Jump Rope program attracts over 300,000 school students, in over 1,500 schools around the country - and this term, Pymble Public School will be doing their part in the fight against heart disease and stroke. This is our larger fundraising year at PPS, to help raise vital funds for this important organisation. On **Friday 12 September**, all children K-6 will enjoy skipping for close to 45 minutes. They are asked to wear mufti clothes, in the theme of red and hearts, ensuring they have enclosed sports shoes, suitable for skipping, (no singlets or midriff tops please).

The Pymble Power Pumpers (the PPS skipping demonstration team) will perform for all students K-6 before the whole school "Jump Off" begins. Parents are welcome to watch our Pymble Power Pumpers perform at 12 noon on the netball court. We will finish the event with each student cooling down with a refreshing ice-block.




Congratulations to Class 1M!

School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.
