SCHOOL FEES AND REFUND POLICY

Parents are reminded that our Excursion Refund Policy is currently available on the school website. Please make sure you are familiar with this policy when making a commitment to send your child on a school organised activity or excursion. As it is the beginning of another school year and as parents you are busy forking out the costs for new uniforms, school books, shoes etc, it is appropriate to again stress the importance of school fees and I am not referring to the school contribution but the fees incurred by your child's participation in a subject that uses consumables. As a school we cannot continue to fund many of the programs and the extensive curriculum choices we offer to our students unless there is a greater commitment by parents and students to meet the costs of these subjects. Students will not be allowed to undertake the practical activities in many of our subjects until the fees are paid for those consumable items in 2012. I understand some families find the costs a real challenge and that is why subjects with no costs are available for student selection and we also offer families the opportunity to pay off the elective fees, a couple of dollars every few weeks.

I encourage parents to contact me directly if there is any particular concern with the payment of elective fees. Please remember those parents who can support the school by paying the general contribution in Term 1 only pay \$60 instead of \$80. Student Assistance Funds given to the school will not be available for students to participate in fee paying electives, these funds will be used to support families with uniform issues or other financial hardships.
