MAINTAINING THE SMART CODE


As assessment tasks draw to a close and final academic reports are being written, there is often a tendency for negative behaviours to start creeping in, for students to take less time and care in their learning and for an increased rate of absenteeism. It is a QHHS expectation that all students continue to wear full and correct uniform, bring all the required equipment for learning, arrive at school on time and attend each day until the end of term. Increasingly Mrs Maricic and I are encountering students who believe that these elements of the SMART code can be ignored towards the end of term. Please join with us in continuing to encourage your child to be a safe, motivated, academic, respectful and tolerant learner.

TEACHERS ARE SMART LEARNERS TOO

Every Wednesday, when all of the students leave for home at 2.30pm, the staff of QHHS embark on even more learning. On Wednesday 6 November, all teaching staff spent the afternoon working together to develop their understanding of above and below the line behaviours. Teachers were given an envelope with a range of behaviours (about 30 in all) and their job was to separate the behaviours into above the line and below the line. In small groups teachers then spent some time discussing different classroom scenarios and what would be the best and most effective way of handling them. Professional development is planned and regular at Quakers Hill High School. Our goal is that all staff are well equipped to focus on our core business – improved student learning outcomes.

JAMBEROO EXCURSION

The invitations for the 2013 Big Day Out excursion went out to students on Monday 11 November. Being a member of the winning house (Oberon) did not automatically qualify students for an invitation this year. Only those students who had consistently maintained the SMART code were invited to attend. As well as members of Oberon, students who had achieved high levels of individual merit throughout the year were also invited. This is part of our ongoing commitment to recognising and rewarding personal excellence in terms of the SMART code. Students who are consistently safe, motivated, academic, respectful and tolerant will be rewarded and recognised in a variety of ways throughout the school year. If your child has been invited, please be aware that they must get their money and permission note in as soon as possible to secure a place on the day. All students who attend Jamberoo will need to have a swimming assessment. This will be conducted on a day prior to the excursion. Year 7 and 8 students who attended swim school will not need to undertake the swimming assessment.

WELFARE CONFERENCE

On Monday 4 November all members of the incoming Welfare Team for 2014 attended a half-day Welfare Conference at Wyndham College run by Mrs White, Mrs Maricic, Ms Paa, Mr Nash and Mrs Mahon. The goal of the conference was to work with the advisers in exploring their vision for their roles. Participants explored their role statements, looked at a range of possible scenarios, explored ways of handling challenging situations and shared expertise. Overall, the day was very highly rated.



WYNDHAM ORIENTATION

Monday 18/11/13 and Tuesday 19/11/13 are the Wyndham Orientation days. Attendance is essential as this is an important opportunity for Year 10 students transitioning into Stage 6 to find out more about the college and thereby to facilitate a smooth entry into senior school. Parents are also reminded of the Information Evening for Parents and Carers. This will consist of a short formal session that will be followed by a tour of the campus and an opportunity to purchase uniforms. Students are reminded to wear their full school uniform on Monday and their sports uniform on Tuesday.

COKE MACHINE

We have had some issues with students purchasing large amounts of Coke and other fizzy and caffeine filled drinks. It is important for all students and parents to remember that these are 'sometime' drinks and it is not healthy for young people to be consuming large quantities. High energy drinks such as V are not allowed on the school premises and, if found, they will be confiscated and disposed of. Students are also reminded that the Coke machine is not to be used during class. It is only available during recess and lunch and it will be removed if students do not follow the expectations around its use.

CYBERBULLYING

As part of our ongoing PBL anti-bullying lessons, we are focussing on cyberbullying this week. Senior Constable Lachlan McCabe is coming to speak to the students about cyberbullying and online safety and the students will be watching some clips and discussing them in roll call. As you would all be aware, cyberbullying is a fast growing problem in our society. In fact, senior lawmakers have commented on the fact that cyberbullying is growing faster than their capacity to create and write legislation to deal with it. This makes it very difficult for parents and teachers to keep up with what is happening but there are things that we can do to protect our children. If your child is being cyberbullied by a fellow student, please take screenshots and inform your child's House Adviser or their Deputy Principal. If it is by a person(s) not connected with the school, please report it to the police. The key point is to make sure it is reported.

ATSI TEAM MEETING - OUTDOOR LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

A team of staff and students along with Mrs Josselyn and Mr Stamatis have been coordinating and working tirelessly on the inclusion of an Aboriginal outdoor learning environment being constructed as part of Quakers Hill High School's school grounds and to enrich the learning environment for students. The Aboriginal outdoor learning environment will be used along with a culturally holistic program for all students and teachers across all subjects, respectfully acknowledging the Dharrug people who are the custodians of the land on which our school is built. The outdoor learning environment will comprise ideas that reflect the bringing together of people sharing ideas and stories. Mr Hutton, the careers advisor, has had his Work Education boys work on the construction and foundation of the initial construction plans. Mrs Josselyn, who is a Visual Arts teacher and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Coordinator, along with Mr Stamatis, will have our Aboriginal students and all students who are gifted and talented in the creative arts, or who take an interest in helping, bring the learning area together. The learning area will have seating in the form of a circle to bring together the idea of a classroom and space to share ideas and stories. It will also have plants that are native to the area and that can also be used for medicinal or cooking purposes. We are hoping to seek community involvement in 2014 to help with the construction, planting and painting of art works that will also be included. We are seeking approval of the space from Maureen Wenzel, who is the Aboriginal Education Consultant for our region.









PRIMARY SCHOOL LINKS WORK EDUCATION PROJECT

Students from Visual Arts and Work Education are coming together under Mrs Josselyn's and Mr Hutton's direction to get involved and create for our local primary schools! Students are using traditional Aboriginal designs to paint our number system and Alphabet on wooden classroom partitions to help primary school students engage and learn in a creative way. The designs involve really delicate and intricate work with a paintbrush and students are hoping to tackle this project within the last 6 weeks of the term! Students have just started undercoating these partitions, but stay tuned for pictures to come within the next few weeks.

SCULPTURE BY THE SEA EXCURSION

Last Friday the Year 8 Elective Visual Arts class along with 60 Year 7 students and Support students attended an excursion to the iconic Bondi Beach to see Sculpture by the Sea. Students walked from Bondi Beach to Tamarama beach and thoroughly enjoyed seeing the artworks and interacting with them and being a part of the craziness for the day. Students photographed works and had lunch near the beach. The weather was warm and it was a great day for students to get involved and to sum up their experiences in Visual Arts this year. PROCEDURE FOR DEALING WITH A BULLYING INCIDENT

STUDENTS



Use strategies taught at school ie walk away, ignore, name the behaviour "You are bullying me."



Tell a teacher, SSO, Year Adviser, parent, Head Teacher, Deputy Principal or Principal. TELL SOMEONE


ALL STAFF



Listen to the student. Support the student to fill out an anti-bullying report (target).



Investigate. Use the Anti-Bullying Contract/ mediation sheet. Record the details on FCW. Consult HT/YA if unsure how to proceed



PARENTS / GUARDIANS



Encourage your child to report any incidents as soon as possible

Do not encourage your child to retaliate in any way in person or via social media



Encourage your child to follow the school's procedures.



If the incident cannot be resolved; if it is a repeat offence with no evidence of a change in behaviour; if it involves cyberbullying or physical violence, (ie it is ABOVE THE LINE) refer immediately to HT, Deputy Principal or Principal.

GRADUATING SYSTEM:

First Instance: Student is warned/counselled. Incident recorded FCW.
2nd Instance: After School Detention (HT)
Third Instance: Parents contacted. Removed from playground for 3 days
Fourth Instance: Formal Caution. (DP)

Fifth Instance: Suspension NOTE: above the line bullying may incur an immediate suspension

Contact the school to ensure that relevant staff are aware of what is happening.

If cyberbullying has taken place please copy and keep the posts as evidence.

Keep an open mind. Remember you are only hearing one side of the story

DO NOT approach the bully yourself or become involved via Facebook or social media.

At Quakers Hill High School the entire school community shares the responsibility for creating a SMART learning community where bullying is not tolerated. A school community where all students are encouraged to report all instances of bullying.

LITERACY NATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS

In conjunction with the teaching of the revised Year 8 Literacy units of work, our whole school focus this term continues to be the correct use of grammar in written and spoken communication. To date we have endeavoured to de-mystify the use of "me, myself,!", "seen, saw", "did, done" and "their, there, they're". In coming weeks we'll be clarifying the correct use of "versus, verse", "brought, bought" whilst following up further on the accurate use of past tense.

All Year 8 students will also be completing a multiple choice reading comprehension assessment this week. This pen and paper assessment will occur during an English period, and will provide the Literacy National Partnerships Team with important information regarding literacy skills acquired this year. We will use this information to further fill our "literacy potholes" through continued teacher professional development (2013, 2014), and the continued development of revised Literacy units for both Year 7 and Year 8.

Despite the school year drawing rapidly to a close the Team will be starting to investigate the comprehension skills required for Numeracy. Mrs Khehra (HT Maths) has very kindly offered to assist in a consultancy role, and is a much-welcomed 'expert' with whom we will most assuredly liaise! Thank you Mrs Khehra!

Commencing Monday 28th October 2013 there will be a change to the bus number of the afternoon School Bus 6.


School Bus 6 will now operate as School Bus 3. There are no changes to times or directions and the service will operate as displayed below:

SWIM SCHOOL 2013

Swim School is on in 2013 for both Year 7 and Year 8. During this time staff and students travel to Blacktown Pool and participate in a swim and survive program that lasts for 1 week for each year group.

Year 7 is on during week 7 of Term 4 (Monday 18th – Friday 22nd November) Year 8 is on during week 8 of Term 4 (Monday 25th- Friday 29th November)

The program caters for all levels from non-swimmers to competent swimmers. Students are asked to indicate their swimming ability on the permission note which has been handed out before it is returned to the front office. Aquatics is a compulsory component of the Year 7 PDHPE program and all students are expected to attend. There will be NO formal lessons at school for Year 7 or 8 during the week their year group is at swim school. The emphasis of the program is on personal survival and rescue techniques. In a country where there are so many drownings at the beach and in backyard pools it is of great importance that our students are confident in and around water.

Some students say that they can swim so they don't need to attend. This is not the case, as by attending each student will achieve a Certificate of Achievement indicating the level of their competency from RSLSA as well as learning survival and resuscitation techniques. This is extremely important as quite often you may need to save the life of someone else. This could be someone in your family or a complete stranger. A couple of years ago a former student from QHHS was walking down to Stanhope Shops when he saw a mother and father who had a young child with them who had stopped breathing. They were in a panic, however the ex-student calmly took control of the situation, used CPR training that he had just learnt from the swim school program and saved the life of the young child. The ex-student received a large write up in two local newspapers and he also received an award for bravery.

Times: Roll call as normal. Students will then be transported to the pool by bus. Students will return to school by 3:00pm.

Cost: \$65 – Swim & Survive Award \$70 – Bronze Star & \$75 for Bronze Medallion (Yr8) (approval required for both of these-see Mr Barry)

Requirements:

- 30+ sunscreen, hat, additional t-shirt to wear in the pool.
- Some students will be required to bring and wear additional clothing into the water as part of their award, however, their instructor will inform them accordingly.
