DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

SURVEYS AND EVALUATIONS

An important feature of the end of every school year is taking the opportunity to look back and reflect on the year. All Australian teachers are regularly reminded of the need to be reflective practitioners and to consider the success of every assessment, lesson and program. Students are also often assessed on their ability to look back at what they did well, what they could do better next time and how they could do it better.

Schools are also required to survey, evaluate, analyse and critically reflect on the year gone by in order to consider how successful they were in meeting their targets and whether or not they need to refine their goals.

As part of our annual system of review and evaluation, students, parents and staff have been surveyed on a range of different things and we have already shared some of the results with the students at last week's assembly.

Approximately 350 students from Years 7 to 10 were surveyed on a range of statements and overall the results were very positive. Some of the statements included "The staff at QHHS are focussed on helping me" and "I understand what it means to be a SMART student" and students were asked to indicate whether they *Strongly Agreed*, *Agreed*, *Disagreed* or *Strongly Disagreed*.

The results will be published in more detail in the Annual School Report but some results are as follows:

93% of students agreed or strongly agreed that they understand what it means to be
a SMART student.
80% that they are encouraged to try lots of different things at QHHS
87% that QHHS has anti-bullying systems in place
92% that there are consequences for students who do not behave appropriately

Some results indicated to us that there are areas where we still need to focus our attention on improving and developing. Some examples are that approximately 20% of students feel that SMART behaviour is not regularly rewarded. These results indicate that this is an area where we need to work together on recognizing and rewarding pro-social and positive behaviours.

One statement and result that stood out to me was "I am encouraged to try different things at QHHS." One of the benefits of belonging to a large high school such as QHHS is that there are many opportunities to try different things and to get involved. The Service to School Assembly provided many such examples of ways in which students can connect to school. Helping out at Parent Teacher nights and Orientation Days, CAPA showcase, peer reading, peer counselling, Premiers Reading Challenge, ICAS competitions, sporting competitions, library monitors and many, many more are all ways in which your child can get involved and thereby feel more engaged and more connected to school. It is very disappointing when students choose not to get involved and therefore spend their entire school career disconnected and adrift. Do encourage your child to get involved and do support their involvement wherever you can. It makes for much stronger connections between school and home.

SWIM SCHOOL

Mrs Maricic, Mrs Claus and I have all taken the opportunity to visit the Stage 4 Swim School program. The feedback from the staff has highlighted the outstanding behaviour of the Year 7 students and the overall good behaviour of the Year 8 students. It was wonderful to see so many students happily engaged in survival swims, resuscitation practice, theory work and safe entry and exits.

QHHS SPORT IN 2015

Every Wednesday during Periods 3 & 4, **Year 7 & 8** students will go to either Grade/Recreational Sport/House Sport.

During Periods 5 & 6, **Year 9 & 10** students will go to either Grade/Recreational Sport/House Sport.

There are usually 3 competitions/rotations of sport that run throughout the year. They do not line up with school terms and the duration can be affected by wet weather etc.

House Sport will operate along similar lines to the previous set up for Integrated Sport. Students in House Sport will be allocated a team and they will play 2 rounds of Sport during this competition.

Early in the term there will be tryouts for grade teams as well as selection processes for recreational and house sports. Students who participate in grade and recreational sports will have to purchase a bus pass that will ensure their travel to and from sporting venues each week. This pass will be available from the front office and will be non-refundable if lost or stolen.

ENGLISH FACULTY NEWS

Year 7 are making infomercials and editing their films, looking at super brands and how they are being marketed.

7R and 7S have created some very entertaining videos based on their unit of study on *Mao's Last Dancer*, as their project-based assessment task on China. They were looking at how Chinese characters are represented in film and they have created some very interesting and individual interpretations of how this occurs. Students have learnt and practised a variety of film making strategies and techniques including stop motion, camera techniques, editing techniques, script writing and research and analysis techniques. This resulted in the recreation of scenes, interviews, trailers and a performance essay. A selection of these videos will be made available to view on the QHHS website.

Year 8 are creating their own picture books, using a variety of different programs – PowerPoint, Storybird, Movie Maker. Teachers of Year 8 are expecting some very good picture books to emerge from their classes. These picture books will be uploaded to the QHHS website in the coming weeks.

Year 9 are continuing their Area of Study on *Conflict*, studying a variety of films, visual and print texts and how they represent the different types of conflict. Students are practising writing extended responses exploring ideas related to the concept of conflict using ALARM scaffolds to assist in structuring their responses.

Venn diagrams have made a return to the curriculum and students have demonstrated their understanding of how these diagrams work. Here are some challenge questions that students can attempt. The first three students who come to Ms Grantham in the maths staffroom with the correct answers will receive a prize.

If you toss a coin 4 times, what is the probability that you will get 4 tails in a row? What is the probability of not drawing the Ace of Hearts out of a deck of cards? Draw a Venn Diagram showing that out of a class of 30 students, 10 play football, 6 play soccer and 3 of these overlap. How many students do not play either of these sports?


YEAR 7 SWIM SCHOOL

Great news! The Improving Literacy and Numeracy National Partnerships Program initiative at Quakers Hill High School will continue into Term 1 2015! This is fantastic news for our students and staff, as young and old alike will continue to reap the rewards of a whole school approach to literacy and numeracy well into the new year.

In preparation for 2015, the Literacy National Partnerships Team is developing a new and exciting project that will involve targeted Year 8 students, whilst continuing to develop the Year 7 Digital Literacy program in collaboration with Mr Brooks. We are also busily polishing up the existing the Year 7 Numeracy program, embedding comprehension strategies into problem-solving tasks so that students will develop greater understanding of what is required when tackling tricky word problems involving mathematical operations. All three programs (Year 7 Digital Literacy, Revised Year 7 Numeracy program and the newly devised Year 8 targeted student program) will be ready for implementation from the start of next year and will provide exciting opportunities for our Stage 4 students to expand upon their current knowledge base in a variety of Key Learning Areas.



CHANGES TO THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS TAX FILE NUMBER PROGRAM IN 2015

Quakers Hill High School was notified this week that The Secondary Schools Tax File Number (TFN) Program will not continue beyond 31 December 2014. This means that School TFN forms will no longer be processed beyond this date.

Any student aged 13 Years or over who wishes to apply for a Tax File Number through Quakers Hill High School MUST complete and return an application form to Mr Hutton or the front office by Tuesday 16th December 2014. Application froms are available from Mr Hutton in the Careers Office, The Careers Display in the Library or the Front Office.

How students can apply for a TFN from 1 January 2015

The Australian Taxation Office in partnership with Australia Post will begin the following process for individuals to apply for a TFN.

Students can now apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.

Applying online is the fastest and most convenient way for students to get a TFN. More information on applying online can be found at www.ato.gov.au by searching for 'QC27248'

Students who are unable to visit a participating Australia Post office will need to complete the application form Tax file number - application or enquiry for individuals form (NAT 1432). More information about lodging this form can be found at www.ato.gov.au by searching for 'QC22604'

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO PARENTS

Re: Whooping Cough - Public Health alert

There has been an increase of whooping cough (Pertussis) notifications in the Western Sydney area since June 2014, particularly in the 2155 postcode area.

In order to prevent further cases of whooping cough Western Sydney Public Health Unit advises the following:

If your child (or any member of your family) has any of the symptoms of whooping cough, such as a dry or persistent cough, which may be especially bad at night, please see your doctor and take this notice with you. A nose and throat swab test can be performed to confirm the diagnosis.

If your child has whooping cough, your doctor will arrange a course of antibiotic treatment. Antibiotics given early in the illness are effective in stopping the cough and in preventing spread to other people. If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough please advise the school and keep your child at home until s/he has taken 5 days of antibiotics.
