TERM 2 LITERACY FOCUS

As part of our ongoing commitment to improving literacy and numeracy, we will be moving to a roll call literacy focus in Term 2. Year 7 & 8 students will be focussing on reading for increased understanding, working out the meaning of words in context and 'here, hidden, head' questions. Year 9 will focus on writing TEEL paragraphs and Year 10 will fcus on skills for Stage 6.

EXAM EXPECTATIONS


TIPS

- Ensure you have a plan on how to approach the exam and which questions you will first.
- Take note of how much each question is worth and use this as a guide for the depty of your response and the time to spend on that question.
- Read each question very carefully underlining the key words and ask yourself what the question is really asking.
- Take the time to brainstorm ideas for essay and jot down a plan before you start. If you become stuck on a question or experience a "mental blank" put a mark next to it, leave it and come back to it later as something in the rest of the exam might give you a clue.
- When you finish, go back and check all of your answers looking for any mistakes or incomplete answers. Ensure nothing is left blank as when you make a guess your answer may be correct.

EXAM RULES

It is important to:

- Write and stop writing when instructed to do so.
- Behave in a way that does not disturb others that includes not to communicate with others.
- Behave in a polite and courteous manner toward supervisors which include invigilators that we have employed and other students.
- Be aware that silly or insulting answers or a non-serious attempt may involve your paper being cancelled.

NUMERACY TEAM RESULTS

In Term 1 the Numeracy team at Quakers Hill High School implemented lesson in Roll calls that targeted areas of weakness for our students. Students in Years 7 and 8 were taught skills relating to Number Theory, and students in Years 9 and 10 where taught skills in regards to Area. At the beginning of Term 1, students completed a pre-test which they re-sat at the end of the term. All year groups displayed a significant improvement in their averages, the value added for each year group is listed below:
