MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

SMART FOCUS

The SMART focus lesson for Week 2 is on moving safely in and around the school. As a school of approximately 1000 students it is very important that as we are moving around that we move in a safe and efficient manner. There is one minor change in our classroom entry script and this is around personal devices and the need to put them away before students enter the classroom. The script that teachers will use is replicated here for your information: "When we enter a classroom we need to remove our earphones and place our personal devices in our school bag. We then unpack our bags and equipment quietly and quickly, place our bags on the ground and start the Do Now Activity."

It is important that all students follow the expectations around movement and ensure that they are within bounds at all times.

Just a reminder about personal electronic devices and their inappropriate use, if you have 3 negative referrals on this it is an after school detention, a 4th incident will result in a Formal Caution of Suspension and a 5th incident may lead to suspension.

Safe Road behaviours

One of the reasons why we are committed to having a person doing duty at the crossing is to ensure that students are supervised and safe at the end of the school day. We have mentioned unsafe behaviours in the past around students running across roads without heeding the traffic lights or oncoming traffic. An ongoing focus area is making sure that all students cross the road at the pedestrian crossing outside the school. Most students behave impeccably, listen carefully and follow all instructions given but there are still some who will run across the road or cross outside of the crossing. Please support us in encouraging appropriate road behaviours by not calling your child across the road away from the crossing.

Changes to School Uniform Policy and associated guidelines

The NSW Department of Education has revised the School Uniform Policy and associated guidelines following an extensive review and consultation process, including with the NSW Parents and Citizens Association. The revised School Uniform Policy requirements include that:

- all students have the opportunity to access the full range of school activities, including physical activities while wearing a school uniform
- girls must have the option to wear shorts and pants
- consideration is given to cost and how to assist families, including for schools to inform parents how they can access financial support to purchase school uniform items.

Where changes are required to a school's uniform, there must be formal consultation with students, teachers and other staff, parents or carers, and the school community (including the Parents and Citizens' Association). Parents and carers should be given up to 3 years to comply with any changes.

These changes afford us a good opportunity to remind parents that girls do have the option to wear shorts as well as pants at QHHS. If your child would prefer to wear shorts please contact the office so we can arrange a fitting or attend the uniform shop on a Monday from 8-9.30am. Furthermore, if purchasing school uniforms is going to impose financial difficulty the school has many clean, second-hand items available for students at no-cost.

HSC Minimum Standards

Parents of Year 10 students who need to re-sit the Minimum Standards Tests in reading, writing and/or numeracy will soon be receiving a letter informing them about an upcoming opportunity to achieve the minimum standards.

Students have two opportunities a year in Years 10, 11 and 12, and five years from the year they start their HSC to meet the HSC minimum standard (even after Year 12). It's important to note the following:

- Students will still be able to sit their HSC exams and receive their HSC results regardless of whether they attain the HSC minimum standard. However, without the minimum standard, they will not receive the Certificate.
- This process does not affect students' ability in receiving an ATAR and applying to university or tertiary education.
- Students who do not meet the HSC minimum standard will still receive a Record of School Achievement (RoSA), which contains a student's record of academic achievement up until the date they leave school.

The tests will be undertaken online in the school hall during the next testing opportunity. Students who are not successful will have further opportunities to achieve the standard. If you are concerned about the test please contact the school.

Year 8 Subject Selection

Year 8 Subject Selection is on Tuesday 14th August in the school hall. Doors open at 6 for a 6.30 start. All students have been informed of the event and this is a great opportunity for students and parents to look at the available subjects, ask questions and start discussions around choices. Upon arrival parents are asked to sign on and collect a package. Students who attend have first option in enrolment voting.

Police talks

On Tuesday 7th August, Constable Megan Williams will be addressing Year 7 students about a range of issues related to their online safety and anti-bullying behaviours. She will be speaking to Year 10 about safe partying. She will be addressing the remainder of the students at a date later in the term.

Education Week

Over the next 2 weeks we will be having a variety of events to celebrate Education Week. Events include Properitas and Future Focused Learning Showcase, Come as your favourite Character for Book Week and many other exciting activities. Semester 2 Fees


