COLLEGIATE RECALIBRATION

We were excited to announce last week that the Nirimba Collegiate Recalibration, expanding Quakers Hill, Riverstone and Seven Hills High Schools, is going ahead. As has been previously outlined, Wyndham College will remain a comprehensive senior high school. Students will have the choice of studying for their HSC at Quakers Hill High or attending Wyndham College. The recalibration begins with the Year 11 in 2021; this will be our current Year 9 group.

At this point, we are busy preparing professional learning for staff, planning accommodation alongside a range of other things. Ms Mahon ran a survey with Year 9 on Monday to gather their thoughts on the changes and this will be run with Year 8 shortly. A parent/carer survey will follow.

Our staff are enthused by this change and are already working hard to make it successful. Many Quakers Hill High School teachers have recent senior school experience, either by taking classes at Wyndham College or teaching in other Year 7-12 schools.

MAKE A DIFFERENCE DAY

On Monday the 29th of July we got the amazing opportunity to attend the New South Wales Parliament House, located on Macquarie Street, Sydney. The Parliament House held a day where Year 10 students from around the state came together to learn about the future of Australia and its government. The day was named the 'Make A Difference Day', which accurately described what it did. We started with a speech by the keynote speaker, who was an elderly Aborginal doctor who had spent her life working from a self-described 'disobedient, gumchewing student who sat in the back row', to excelling at Medical School at age 25, to a doctor for the Royal Flying Doctor Service,



where she works today. She has the opportunity to fly from Sydney daily to Broken Hill, where she provides her services as a General Practitioner to the people in surrounding towns, who do not regularly get this sort of opportunity.

She spoke about her personal beliefs on morals, beliefs and how she believes the government should be in the future. She also had the opportunity to speak about her late mother, who spent her time diligently fighting for Aboriginal rights, on the back-end of the 1967 referendum.

This speech was followed by an interactive session where the students, including us, were broken up into several groups which explored referendums, plebiscites, parliamentary decisions and how we can make a difference by being students and regular citizens. This day was very interesting, informative and helped us to greatly understand Australian politics. It also gave us an insight into the life of a very influential person in the Australian Aboriginal Rights Movement.
