

## IMPORTANT NEWS FOR STUDENTS & PARENTS

### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Now that we are in the second half of Term 4, a number of school events are nearing. This means that the school is an extremely busy place at the moment! I took the opportunity to remind students on our Monday assembly that whilst the examination period is over, there is still a large amount of course work to complete in their various subjects. There is no excuse for poor application or behaviour that is inconsistent with our SMART Code.

#### **SCHOOL TARGETS**

The Department of Education's Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation has set targets for each school in the areas of Reading, Numeracy, Attendance and Wellbeing, as well as specific targets for Aboriginal students.

The Reading and Numeracy targets aim to increase the number of students in the top two achievement bands. The Attendance target aims to increase the number of students attending school 90% of the time or more. In 2020, the main focus of our school planning in this area will be on the compulsory Reading and Numeracy targets.

#### REMEMBERANCE DAY

The school honoured Remembrance Day on Monday 11 November with a service during our assembly. This was organised by Mr Andrews and involved a number of student participants, as well as a beautiful display of ceramic poppies made by students. #### YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE

In Week 5, a large number of Year 10 students undertook work experience in a diverse range of workplaces. Some Year 10 students are still in the process of completing work experience this week and next. This initiative allows students to experience life as a full time employee, away from the comfortable structures they are used to. I would like to acknowledge the work of our Careers Adviser, Mr Hutton and Deputy Principal, Mrs Maricic, for their tireless efforts with so many students. They were assisted by a number of staff which we are similarly grateful to.
