## **MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

#### YEAR 10 - 11 SUBJECT SELECTION PROCESS

Our Year 10 students are currently in the process of absorbing a significant amount of information related to their senior school options for 2022. On Tuesday 18 May, we held a highly successful Senior Subject Information Evening. This evening was well attended and gave students and parents & carers the opportunity to speak with teachers from each subject area about what is on offer for them at Quakers Hill High School in 2022. Mr Head also gave a brief presentation on the HSC and how curriculum patterns can be formed. Ms Joanne Andrew, Relieving Collegiate Deputy Principal, also joined us to assist with providing information on the subject selection process. I would like to thank all staff who attended the night and gave up their time to assist students. In particular, I would like to recognise Mr Head as chief organiser of the event.

Year 10 also attended a Collegiate Senior Subject Taster Day at Wyndham College on Thursday 27 May. This provided them with a further opportunity to experience what senior subjects are like, which will again assist them in their decision making.

#### **SMART EXPECTATIONS**

Students are regularly reminded of, and take part in, lessons on our SMART Code of Conduct. The SMART Code underpins all that we do at Quakers Hill High School to keep students Safe, Motivated, Academic, Respectful and Tolerant.

It is an unfortunate reality in high schools that from time to time, students don't meet these expectations and require consequences which assist them to make better choices in the future. Students are regularly and clearly reminded to treat each other and their teachers with the utmost respect. Aggressive or violent behaviour is utterly unacceptable and will not be tolerated. In the case of violence, suspensions from school are imposed and police may also be informed. Whilst this isn't a common occurrence at our school, it is something that all students must be aware of.

Likewise, it is a basic expectation that all students follow instructions given to them by members of staff. It is very heartening to report, however, that the vast majority of students at Quakers Hill High School follow out SMART Code every day and make the most of every moment they are at school. It has also been fantastic to present Principal's Awards at our whole school assemblies each Monday, now that these can run again. Parents and carers, please speak with your children in relation to the points raised above, and feel free to contact the school should you have any questions.

#### PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students are reminded that their mobile phones and other personal electronic devices must be silent and out of sight at all times in classes. This includes ear phones and other devices not authorised as part of the lesson. Mobile phones in classrooms can be a significant distraction to the owner and also has the potential to disrupt the learning of other students and the work of the teacher. Likewise, students' personal electronic devices should never be used to photograph or record other people without their consent.
