HSC Updates

Our first HSC in over 20 years is in full swing with students from both Quakers Hill High School and Seven Hills High School having already completed several exams. Students and staff have generally been pleased with the questions, describing them as 'tough but fair.' Once students had that first English exam under their belts most felt much more confident about the days and weeks ahead. Students have been completing the exams in the school hall which has impacted the rest of school in some ways. A noticeable impact for the students is that the area around the hall has been roped off and students have been required to sit at some distance. We have been very proud of the majority of students who have demonstrated deep respect in staying away from the hall and minimising noise.

Year 7-10 Examinations

Over the next three weeks, students in Years 7 to 10 will be undertaking their whole cohort and elective exams. Some of these will be held in the hall while others will be undertaken in individual classrooms. Irrespective of where exams are undertaken, examination behaviour is expected to be in accordance with the smart expectations. Prior to every exam the staff supervisor will read out the SMART examination script which is captured here below for your information. All examination schedules have been emailed to the students who have also been provided with a hard copy. Students are reminded that being absent for an exam requires the completion and submission of a misadventure form. Misadventure forms can be downloaded from the school website or hard copies can be collected from the front office. If students are unsure of what or how to revise, they are strongly encouraged to seek assistance from their class teacher, Year Adviser or Learning and Support staff.

Once again, we have employed examination supervisors to assist with the supervision of exams. Teachers use the extra time available to them to collaboratively mark, complete marking, provide feedback and begin composing report comments.

We wish all students the very best in all of their end of year examinations.

Exam Script Extracts

- Any student found with notes, paper, unauthorised material or any communication device, such as a mobile telephone will receive a penalty, such as a zero for this examination.
- If you have any of these items on you, please raise your hand and they will be collected and returned to you at the end of this exam. There will be no penalty if they are handed in now.
- Throughout the examination you must remain in your seat and be silent. You are not to attempt to speak to or communicate in any way with any of the other students. If you have a question, please raise your hand and a teacher will help you. Teachers will not read the question, explain words or questions to you so do not ask.

NOTE: You will be warned once if you are not following the exam rules. A teacher will write 'warned', what you were warned for and the time you were warned on the

front of your paper. If you act inappropriately a second time, than you will be removed from the examination room and will receive a zero. You must attempt all parts of the paper and do your best.

Students considered to have made a non-serious attempt will be expected to redo the paper.

- Watches are to be removed and placed in clear view on your table.
- Equipment should be in a clear bag or pencil case.
- Water bottles are to be placed on the floor.
- No one may begin writing until instructed to do so, and all students must stop immediately when instructed to do so.
- No student can leave the room during this examination.
- You will be required to write your name on every page of your writing booklets.

SMART expectations are for everyone

The modern world is a busy one full of pressures, stressors and difficulties and this can mean that frustrations run high, and patience can be in short supply. Moreover, many parents will have read about the substantial teacher shortage and its immediate impact. Staffing is always a tricky balancing act that is made more difficult with the current teacher shortage. Our students are at the forefront of all our decisions – even when these may be less than ideal. If you are concerned or frustrated by

class or staff changes, please reach out and we can make some time to talk through any decisions that have impacted your child.

TAFE opportunities

Well over 40 of our Year 10 students are currently participating in a diverse range of TAFE courses. With the current skill shortage across multiple industries this is a wonderful opportunity for our young people to experience different industries and build their skills and experience. Mr Hutton has worked tirelessly to support our students in these applications, and we thank him for his efforts.

School Travel

Term 4 2022

2023 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2023 open from Monday 10 October 2022.

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2023 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details before **the end of term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2023 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2023.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Travel from Term 1 2023

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2023 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2022, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Students using School Opal cards are also reminded that they must tap on and tap off in line with the <u>Student code of conduct</u> and <u>Opal terms of use</u>.

In Term 4 across the western Sydney bus region we'll be running a campaign to increase the correct use of Opal Cards on the bus network. If students don't tap on and tap off every time, then school bus services will appear underutilised with low passenger numbers, which can affect planning of services for your school. Our campaign message is simple tap on and tap off your Opal card, every time you travel by bus.

During Term 4 we encourage your school to share resources and information within the communications toolkit to students, parents and carers.

BELL SIGNALS SYSTEM

There are various bell signals which tell students and staff what to do.

SINGLE RING indicates the start of the day, end of lessons or breaks and the end of the day.

TWO RINGS indicate an assembly in the quadrangle has been called. All students and staff should assemble in the quad as quickly as possible.

THREE RINGS indicate that the oval is closed due to extreme heat or rain. Undercover walkways become in-bounds for that break.

WHOOP SOUND indicates that an evacuation is necessary. Students and staff must evacuate the buildings and assemble on the oval.

DOORBELL SOUND indicates a lockdown is required. All students and staff must remain in the buildings, close and lock all doors and wait for the all clear (which is two rings calling everyone to the
