Dear parents and carers,

Last week we sent an email to all parents, carers and students acknowledging some communication challenges and glitches. Following some feedback from our community, we realised that a technical issue with the Sentral Parent Portal meant our regular communications were not visible. They had been uploaded correctly but not accessible on the Portal. This issue has now been addressed, and our technology team has endeavoured to update the school website with archived copies of all recent communications. These can be found under the "newsletter" tab. I have also requested that each newsletter or important communication to our community is emailed *and* made available on the Sentral Parent Portal. We encourage Portal use as much as possible, as it is a great way to assist our two-way communication about attendance, school reports, newsletters, etc. while also understanding that email is the preferred method for many to receive communications.

This issue has highlighted the value and importance of community feedback to help us improve our processes. Besides our current communications platforms such as newsletters, our website, Facebook, Instagram and Sentral, I encourage parents and carers to reach out and share questions, queries, or concerns via phone through the front office or by email if more convenient. If you ever want to make an appointment to speak with me directly, I welcome the opportunity to connect with our community and discuss how to support our students and make our great school even better. Another great way to connect is through attendance at P&C meetings. Our next meeting is Monday 12 Sept on site from 6.30pm for a chat and some light refreshments, then 7pm for the actual meeting. Attendance Matters

Based on the ongoing articles, parents would be aware that attendance is a very strong focus for us as a school and indeed it is one of our focus areas in our strategic improvement plan. Our goal is to have as many students as possible attending over 90% of the time. There are various ways and means that we use to encourage students to attend regularly and we have definitely seen an improvement this semester

One of the key ways in which parents can support our attendance targets is by ensuring that you provide an explanation for any student absence. There are multiple ways that you can do this and the most popular seems to be responding to the absence SMS that is sent each morning at approximately 10 AM. If you know that your child is going to be away you can contact the school office the day before and the projected absence can be entered into the system, if you know that your child is going to be absent for a protracted period of time it is important that you contact us so that we can work with you in applying for an exemption for that period of time.

Every week 3 and week 8, Mr Dacey and Mrs Mahon undertake an attendance data harvest to examine the numbers of unexplained absences. The list of students with unexplained absences are sent to roll call teachers who will make contact with parents, in the spirit of healthy competition we will be running 'An attendance matters' competition as outlined below. The focus is on being the roll call class with the least unexplained absences.

To further encourage improved attendance we are moving to recognising 100% attendance for each fortnight rather than just each term, this will be entered as a positive referral and students who have 100% attendance for the term will receive a bronze certificate in recognition and appreciation of their high level attendance.

So far we have 147 students who have 100% attendance for Term 3 and 470 (55%) students who have over 90% attendance for Term 3. Lets see if we can get those percentages even higher for Term 4.



For the rest of Term 3 and for Term 4 we are running a whole school competition on explaining absence. If you are absent ensure you bring a note or that your parent responds to the SMS, calls the school or emails to let the school know of the reason for your absence. The roll call with the least unexplained absences will win a pizza lunch at the beginning of Term 4.

BELL SIGNALS SYSTEM

There are various bell signals which tell students and staff what to do.

SINGLE RING indicates the start of the day, end of lessons or breaks and the end of the day.

TWO RINGS indicate an assembly in the quadrangle has been called. All students and staff should assemble in the quad as quickly as possible.

THREE RINGS indicate that the oval is closed due to extreme heat or rain. Undercover walkways become in-bounds for that break.

WHOOP SOUND indicates that an evacuation is necessary. Students and staff must evacuate the buildings and assemble on the oval.

DOORBELL SOUND indicates a lockdown is required. All students and staff must remain in the buildings, close and lock all doors and wait for the all clear (which is two rings calling everyone to the
