#### **Strategic Improvement**

#### **Financial Contributions**

Earlier this week we sent out the annual statement of account accompanied by a letter about financial contributions. Thank you to all who have already paid some or all of these contributions.

If you have not already done so, please make sure you have read the letter as it explains the importance of financial contributions to our capacity to create high quality, innovative and engaging activities for our students.

You may be aware that school funding is frequently in the news. The current issue of concern to public schools is around the equity of funding for public and non-government schools. While the base level of funding we receive means we can deliver a simple level of teaching and learning resources, parent and carer contributions have al-

ways been vital to us being able to go beyond basics. This includes having quality modern equipment in practical spaces, a well resourced and dynamic library, plentiful technology, and a range of digital resources for students to access at school and at home.

To reiterate one of the messages in the letter, voluntary contributions and course contributions are not mandatory. However, as I have noted they are vitally important to resourcing our school to the extent that parents, students and teachers expect. Please let us know if you are having difficulty paying these contributions. It is always okay to pay them off gradually over the course of the year. The School Bytes platform makes this very straightforward, and it is also fine to pay in cash or by EFTPOS at the office

#### **Facilities**

In other finance and facilities news, our projects using the "use it or lose it" funds I have previously mentioned are forging ahead. The new basketball court is currently being excavated and should be finished before the end of the term. The electronic gate project is finally almost finished at the Eastern end of our site.

Other plans involve installing air conditioning in the last two teaching spaces that do already have them, plus some office spaces that missed out in previous rounds. We are also looking to use some funds we receive from community users (karate, basketball, drama, etc), the canteen, and hopefully a donation from the P&C to fund some new signage at the front of our school. We are also planning to use some of that same community user funds to finally ventilate our hall with whirly birds and new quieter fans, which we are hoping will be ready for our end of year events.
